

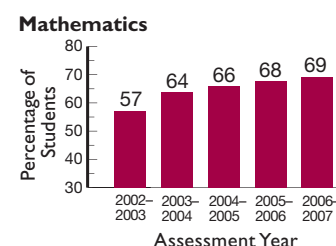
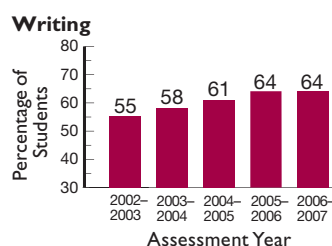
Highlights of the Provincial Results

- The primary division assessment is based on *The Ontario Curriculum, Grades 1–8*.

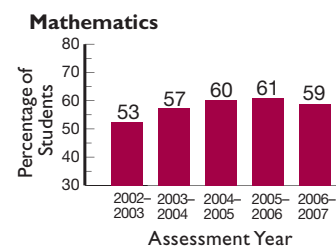
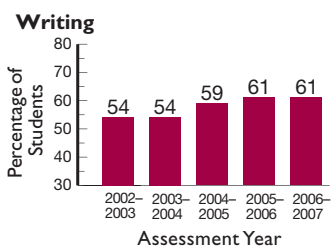
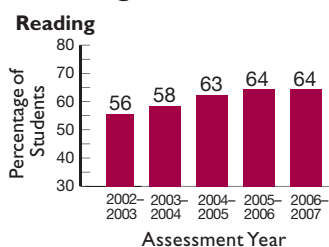
Percentage of All Grade 3 Students at or Above the Provincial Standard (Levels 3 and 4) Over Time

- The junior division assessment is based on *The Ontario Curriculum, Grades 1–8*.

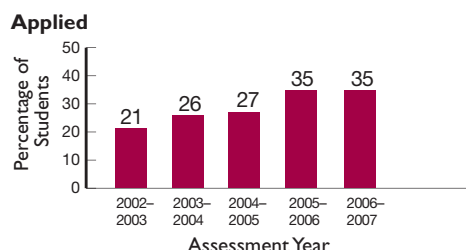
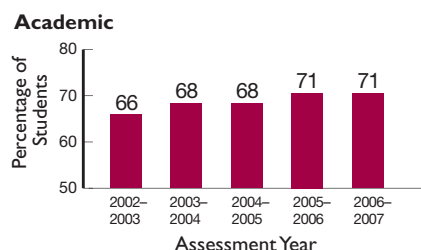
Percentage of All Grade 6 Students at or Above the Provincial Standard (Levels 3 and 4) Over Time



Grade 9 Assessment of Mathematics

- 103 011 students in academic programs and 49 056 students in applied programs wrote between January 10 and 24 and June 5 and June 21, 2007.
- The Grade 9 assessment is based on *The Ontario Curriculum, Grades 9 and 10: Mathematics* (revised 2005).
