Highlights of First Quarter 2012

June 21, 2012

Population Growth

Ontario's population reached 13,472,438 on April 1, 2012, with growth of 27,030 people in the first quarter of 2012. This compares to growth of 30,980 in the same quarter of the previous year.

Births and Deaths

Births and deaths increased by 1.2% and 3.8%, respectively, from the same quarter of 2011.

Natural increase (births minus deaths) was 8,894 in the quarter, down from 9,441 in the same quarter of 2011.

International Migration

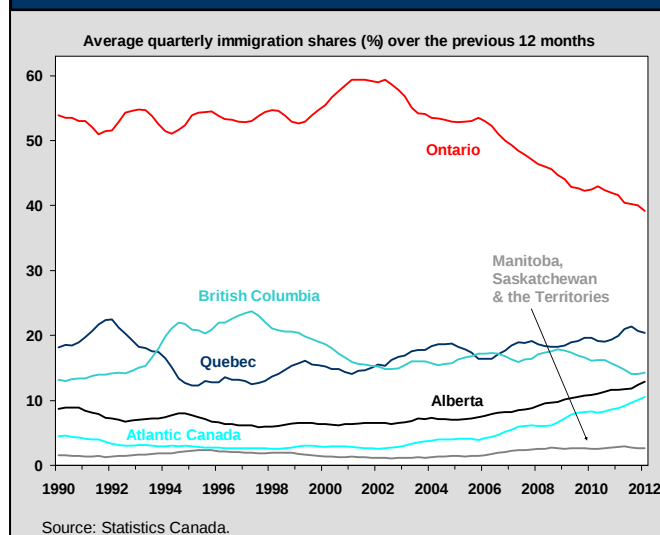
Immigration to Ontario was 20,699 in the quarter, up 2.9% from the same quarter of the previous year. Ontario received 37.3% of all immigrants to Canada in the quarter, down from 40.6% in the same quarter of 2011. Over the last 12 months Ontario received 100,042 immigrants, down from 113,784 during the previous year.

There were 3,779 emigrants from Ontario in the quarter, little changed from 3,761 in the same quarter of the previous year. Ontario accounted for 42.4% of all emigration from Canada in the quarter.

The number of non-permanent residents in Ontario (NPRs – i.e. foreign students, visa workers, refugee claimants) increased by 5,148 to 267,813 in the first quarter.

In summary, net international migration was 22,068 in the first quarter, down from 22,229 in the same quarter of 2011.

Interprovincial Migration

In the first quarter of 2012, Ontario had a net loss of 3,932 people to other provinces compared to a net loss of 690 people in the same quarter of 2011. Ontario experienced net gains in its exchanges with five of the 12 other provinces and territories, with the largest net gains from Quebec (1,537) and Manitoba (223). Ontario's largest net losses were with Alberta (-4,369) and Saskatchewan (-669). Over the last 12 months, Ontario's total net interprovincial migration loss was 6,353, compared to a 1,871 loss during the previous year.

Year-Over-Year Growth

Over the last 12 months, Ontario's population grew by 142,216 or 1.1%, lower than growth of 155,599 during the previous year. Among the provinces, Alberta and Saskatchewan had the highest population growth rates (2.4% and 1.9% respectively). Canada's population growth rate over the period was 1.1%.

1. Statistics Canada's population estimates, components of change and age groups are 2006 Census-based adjusted for net undercoverage.

2. Except for Canada, all projections are produced by the Ontario Ministry of Finance (Spring 2012). Projections for Canada are from Statistics Canada (based on 2006 Census).

3. Total dependency ratio is the ratio of the population aged 0-19 and 65+ to the population aged 20-64.

4. Total Fertility Rates and life expectancy estimates are for calendar year, and projections are for census year. Life expectancy estimates for years after 2005 represent three-year averages (e.g., 2008 reported life expectancy corresponds to the average recorded over 2007-2009).

5. Families and households are Census data.

6. In the "Components of Change" table, flows are for the 12-month period July 1 to June 30. Net international migration is calculated as the net balance of immigrants, net emigrants and net non-permanent residents (NPRs).

Note: All population figures are for July 1st.
