

Highlights of First Quarter 2013

June 19, 2013

Population Growth

Ontario's population reached 13,583,710 on April 1, 2013, with growth of 22,676 people in the first quarter of 2013. This compares to growth of 25,663 in the same quarter of the previous year.

Births and Deaths

Births and deaths increased by 1.0% and 4.0%, respectively, from the same quarter of 2012.

Natural increase (births minus deaths) was 7,627 in the quarter, down slightly from 8,313 in the same quarter of 2012.

International Migration

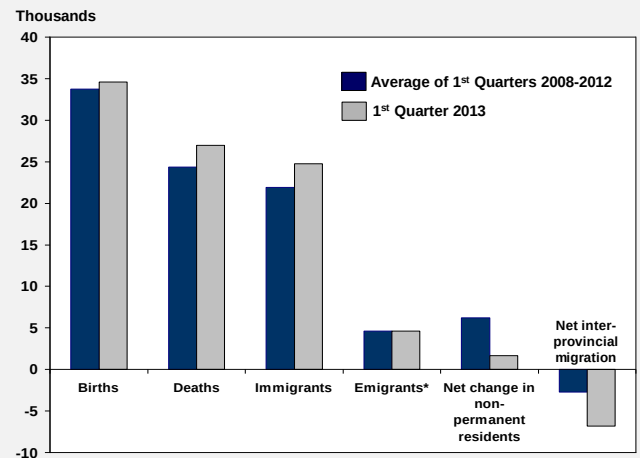
Immigration to Ontario was 24,782 in the quarter, an increase of 19.6% compared to the same quarter of the previous year. Ontario received 42.6% of all immigrants to Canada in the quarter, up from 37.3% in the same quarter of 2012. Over the last 12 months, Ontario received 103,143 immigrants, up slightly from 100,240 in the previous year.

There were 4,599 emigrants from Ontario in the quarter, essentially unchanged from 4,574 in the same quarter of the previous year. Ontario accounted for 44.1% of all emigration from Canada in the quarter.

The number of non-permanent residents in Ontario (NPRs – i.e. foreign students, visa workers, refugee claimants) increased by 1,689 to 281,793 in the quarter.

In summary, net international migration was 21,872 in the first quarter, up from 20,895 in the same quarter of 2012.

Interprovincial Migration

In the first quarter of 2013, Ontario had a net loss of 6,823 people to other provinces compared to a loss of 3,545 people in the same quarter of 2012. Ontario experienced net gains in its exchanges with four of the 12 other provinces and territories, with the largest net gains from Nova Scotia (136) and Nunavut (111). Ontario's largest net losses were with Alberta (-6,032) and Quebec (-518). Over the last 12 months, Ontario's total net interprovincial migration loss was 20,839 compared to a 5,671 loss during the previous year.

Year-Over-Year Growth

Over the last 12 months, Ontario's population grew by 119,240 or 0.9%, lower than growth of 140,035 during the previous year. Among the provinces, Alberta and Saskatchewan had the highest population growth rates (3.2% and 1.9% respectively). Canada's population growth rate over the period was 1.1%.

1. Statistics Canada's population estimates, components of change and age groups are 2006 Census-based adjusted for net undercoverage.
2. Except for Canada, projections are produced by the Ontario Ministry of Finance (Spring 2012). Projections for Canada are from Statistics Canada (based on 2006 Census).
3. Total dependency ratio is the ratio of the population aged 0-19 and 65+ to the population aged 20-64.
4. Total Fertility Rates and life expectancy estimates are for calendar year, and projections are for census year. Life expectancy estimates for years after 2005 represent three-year averages (e.g., 2008 reported life expectancy corresponds to the average recorded over 2007-2009).
5. Families and households are Census data.
6. In the "Components of Change" table, flows are for the 12-month period July 1 to June 30. Net international migration is calculated as the net balance of immigrants, net emigrants and net non-permanent residents (NPRs).
