

Highlights of Fourth Quarter 2013

March 19, 2014

Population Growth

Ontario's population reached 13,598,676 on January 1, 2014, with growth of 12,789 people in the fourth quarter of 2013. This compares to growth of 17,495 in the same quarter of the previous year.

Births and Deaths

Births and deaths increased by 0.9% and 4.3%, respectively, from the same quarter of 2012.

Natural increase (births minus deaths) was 10,961 in the quarter, down slightly from 11,626 in the same quarter of 2012.

International Migration

Immigration to Ontario was 22,704 in the quarter, down 8.2% from the same quarter of the previous year. Ontario received 38.0% of all immigrants to Canada in the quarter, down from 39.7% in the same quarter of 2012. Over the last 12 months Ontario received 103,405 immigrants, up from 99,159 during the previous year.

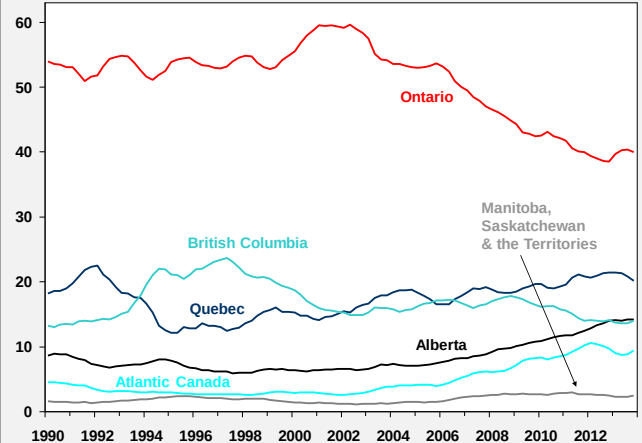
There were 4,084 emigrants from Ontario in the quarter, parctically unchanged from the same quarter of the previous year. Ontario accounted for 38.9% of all emigration from Canada in the quarter.

The number of non-permanent residents in Ontario (NPRs – i.e. foreign students, visa workers, refugee claimants) decreased by 16,414 to 281,271 in the fourth quarter.

In summary, net international migration was 2,206 in the fourth quarter, down from 9,930 in the same quarter of 2012.

Interprovincial Migration

In the fourth quarter of 2013, Ontario had a net loss of 378 people to other provinces compared to a net loss of 4,061 people in the same quarter of 2012. Ontario experienced net gains in its exchanges with eight of the 12 other provinces and territories, with the largest net gains from Quebec (1,915) and Prince Edward Island (109). Ontario's largest net losses were with Alberta (-2,590) and Newfoundland and Labrador (-82). Over the last 12 months, Ontario's total net interprovincial migration loss was 13,039 compared to a net loss of 18,648 during the previous year.

Year-Over-Year Growth

Over the last 12 months, Ontario's population grew by 123,736 or 0.9%, lower than growth of 132,555 during the previous year. Among the provinces, Alberta and Saskatchewan had the highest population growth rates (3.4% and 1.8% respectively). Canada's population growth rate over the period was 1.2%.
