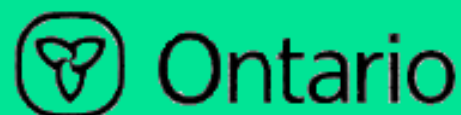

Subject **THE TERRITORY OF NUNAVUT**

With the creation of the new Territory of Nunavut effective April 1, 1999, the Ministry of Health for the Province of Ontario and the Interim Commissioner for the Territory of Nunavut have signed a reciprocal agreement between the province and the territory for medical and hospital reciprocal billing.

Ontario providers who render services to eligible residents of the Territory of Nunavut are reminded to submit their reciprocal claims to the ministry for payment in the usual manner. The provincial code for administrative billing purposes is NU and is not intended for any purpose other than identifying the territory under the interprovincial reciprocal billing arrangement.

The Territory of Nunavut's card can be recognized by the following description:

FRONT

The card is printed on a light grey background. The lower left corner features a map of North America in red with the Territory of Nunavut highlighted in dark grey. Superimposed over the map is a white circular logo with the words NUNAVUT CANADA * NUNAVUT KANATAMI * Syllabics. Superimposed and across the top of the card in black letters and over the word NUNAVUT is Syllabics * ANIAKTAILINIK * HEALTH * SANTE. This represents the three official languages Inuktituk, English and French. In black letters in the center of the card is the following:

The 9 digit Health Care number
Surname
Given Name
Date of Birth Expiry Date

The bottom right corner of the card has Syllabics (meaning Nunavut in Inuktituk).

BACK

The back of the card is the same light grey as the front. Printed across the back, in the 3 official languages and syllabics is the mailing address for Health Services Administration, Nunavut Department of Health and the toll free number 1-800-661-0833. There is a signature block and the same white circular logo that appears on the front of the card.

The first digit of every Nunavut Health card will begin with the number 1. The 2nd through 7th digits are the former NWT Health Care Numbers while the 9th digit denotes the program eligibility indicator. An example of the card is shown on the attached Appendix "A".
