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Re: Physician Payment for Administration of Intranasal Influenza Vaccine

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Effective October 26, 2015 a new fee code has been introduced for the administration of the intranasal influenza vaccine. The new fee code and the fee are:

G592 - Administration of intranasal influenza vaccine	1.65
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This fee code is only eligible for payment for children and adolescents 2 to 17 years of age.

Claims billed for services provided for patients outside of this age range will reject to the error report with error code A2A – Outside of Age Limit.

G700 (Basic fee-per-visit premium) is eligible for payment with the G592.

Implementation of the G592 fee code into Ministry claims systems will occur on November 1, 2015. Physicians are asked to hold their claims until after November 1, 2015. Claims submitted prior to November 1, 2015 will reject but can be resubmitted after November 1, 2015.
