BUSINESS:

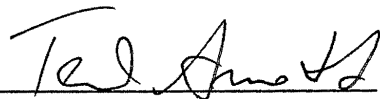
The Minister of Citizenship and Multiculturalism presented the Ministry's plan to the Board. The Board had an opportunity to ask questions of the Minister and Ministry staff in attendance.

The Board approved the request for events to take place on the Legislative grounds for the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III on Saturday, May 6, 2023 based on the following conditions and this information will be provided to the organizers.

- The organizer is responsible for ensuring site cleanup throughout and following the event to the satisfaction of the Assembly. The Assembly in its sole discretion may supplement maintenance to ensure its standards are maintained and any costs of such services will be charged back to the event organizer.
- The event organizer is responsible for costs incurred by the Legislative Protective Service for the event.
- All activities related to "Royal Family Fund Day" may open once the official ceremonial event has concluded.
- Amusement devices must be appropriately staffed and meet all safety requirements as outlined in the TSSA guidelines.
- Amusement devices must close at 6:00 p.m. sharp.
- All equipment related to the event must be dismantled and removed from the grounds no later than 6:00 a.m. on Sunday, May 7th, 2023.
- Cabinet Office will create and disseminate public communications and respond to media inquiries related to the event.
- The display of commercial brands or promotional material of any kind at this event is prohibited.

- The use of barbecues is permitted at this event. Organizers are responsible to ensure that TSS requirements are followed.
- Generators to be used must be fuelled offsite and no fuel canisters are permitted on the Legislature grounds.
- Tents must be secured in place with weights, as the use of stakes is not permitted on the Legislative grounds.
- The Speaker of the Legislative Assembly of Ontario is included in the official ceremonies taking place at the courtesy flag pole at 11:00 a.m.
