WN #1: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 8. Policies, etc., to be followed, and records
Specifically failed to comply with the following subsections:

s. 8. (1) Where the Act or this Regulation requires the licensee of a long-term care home to have, institute or otherwise put in place any plan, policy, protocol, procedure, strategy or system, the licensee is required to ensure that the plan, policy, protocol, procedure, strategy or system,
(a) is in compliance with and is implemented in accordance with applicable requirements under the Act; and
(b) is complied with. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 8 (1).

Findings/Faits saillants :

1. An identified resident fell in 2011 and sustained an injury. The home's Falls policy states the staff are to inform the family regarding the fall, assess the resident for pain and contact the physician for further direction and to complete the Morris Fall Risk Assessment for a resident who has had multiple falls in a quarter to determine new possible causes for the fall. The home failed to follow their policy and procedure related to Falls - Policy Number - 09-02-01 and did not call the resident's family regarding the fall, did not complete the Morris Fall Risk Assessment for the resident and did not assess the resident for pain post fall and contact the physician for further direction related to the resident's pain.

Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure the licensee of a long term care home to have, institute or otherwise put in place any plan, policy, protocol, procedure, strategy or system, the licensee is required to ensure that the plan, policy, protocol, procedure, strategy or system is complied with, to be implemented voluntarily.

WN #2: The Licensee has failed to comply with O.Reg 79/10, s. 49. Falls prevention and management
Specifically failed to comply with the following subsections:

s. 49. (2) Every licensee of a long-term care home shall ensure that when a resident has fallen, the resident is assessed and that where the condition or circumstances of the resident require, a post-fall assessment is conducted using a clinically appropriate assessment instrument that is specifically designed for falls. O. Reg. 79/10, s. 49 (2).

Findings/Faits saillants :



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1. An identified resident had a fall in 2011 and sustained an injury. Review of the resident's progress notes, electronic file and interview with staff confirm that a post fall assessment was not completed using a clinically appropriate assessment instrument that is specifically designed for falls to determine the contributing factors related to the fall and develop strategies and interventions to minimize further falls for the resident.

Additional Required Actions:

VPC - pursuant to the Long-Term Care Homes Act, 2007, S.O. 2007, c.8, s.152(2) the licensee is hereby requested to prepare a written plan of correction for achieving compliance to ensure that when a resident has fallen, the resident is assessed and that where the condition or circumstances of the resident require, a post fall assessment is conducted using a clinically appropriate assessment instrument that is specifically designed for falls, to be implemented voluntarily.
