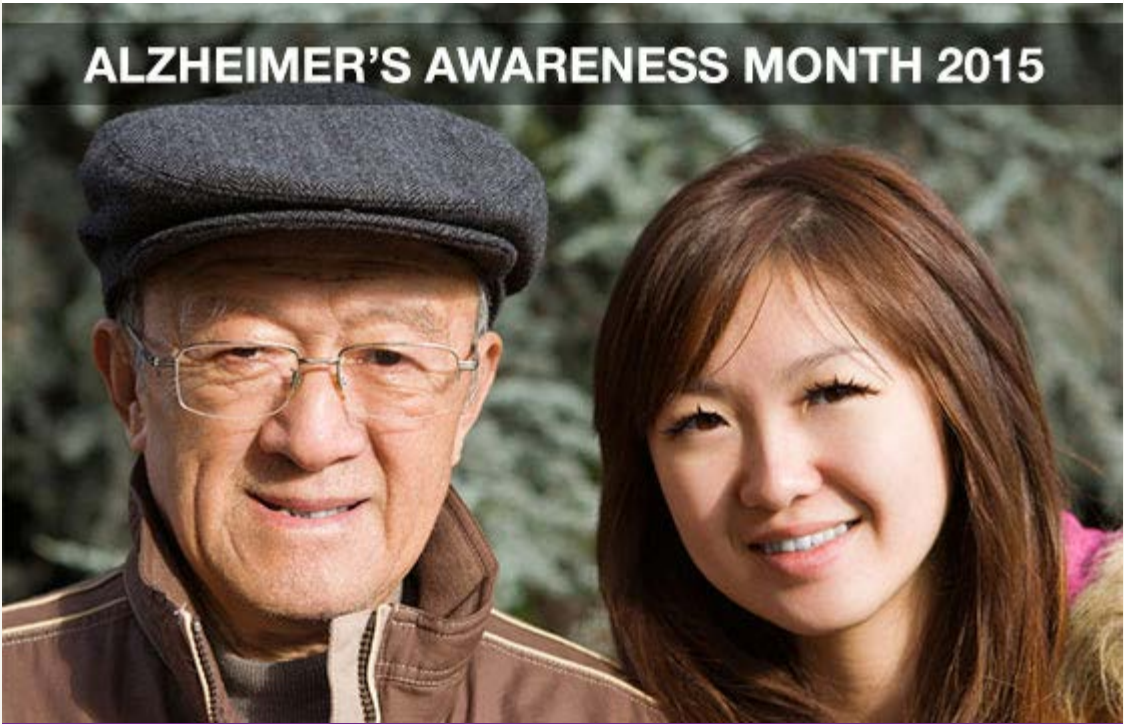

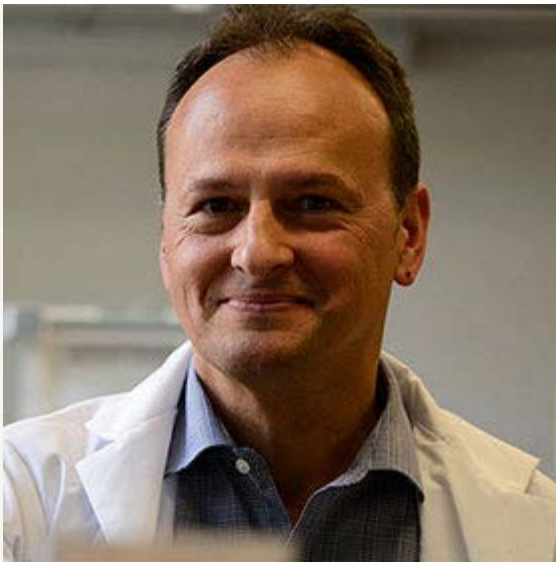




CAMH RESEARCH: ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE

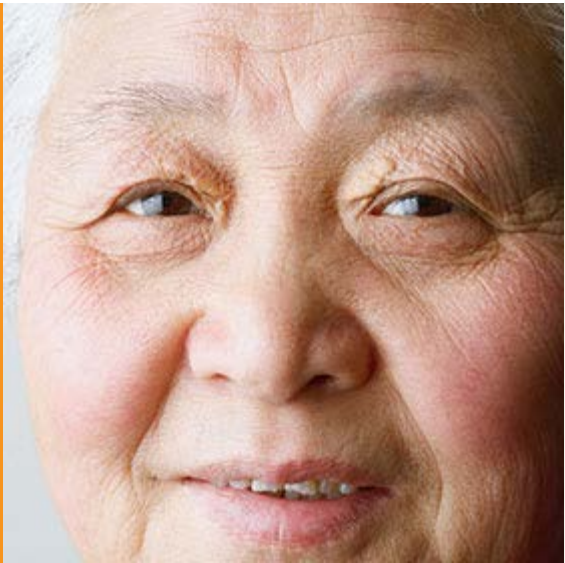
