The government of Ontario is committed to providing the information healthcare providers require in order to deliver the services needed to manage SARS. As part of these ongoing communications, the government will be issuing a SARS bulletin on a regular basis to inform healthcare professionals of new directives and other pertinent information.

This bulletin provides an update on new directives and communications and does not replace or amend these documents.

KEY INFORMATION FOR HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS

- While the Acting Commissioner of York Region Health Services has declared the SARS outbreak in that region over (because more than two ten-day incubation periods have passed since the last reported probable case), the provincial health emergency remains in effect until further notice.
- There are three remaining SARS assessment clinics: Rouge Valley, Queensway and Markham.

DIRECTIVES

- A letter prefacing a series of directives was issued yesterday.
- Directives for providers in community settings and community healthcare agencies (excluding CCACs) were issued yesterday.
- Directives for CCACs were issued yesterday.
- Directives for non-acute care facilities were issued yesterday.
- Directives for acute care hospitals were issued yesterday.
- Directives for acute care hospitals pertaining to high-risk procedures for SARS patients were issued yesterday.
- Please consult your facility administration and organization/college to obtain copies of these and all directives issued to date.

NEWS

- The World Health Organization will hold an international conference on SARS in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia on June 17 and 18, 2003.

KEY SARS FACTS

- 20 days have passed since any transmission of SARS in Ontario.
- All healthcare providers are reminded to adhere to infection control, hand-washing and isolation protocols.
- The number of affected individuals continues to drop – there are now 10 people hospitalized, 78% less than 10 days ago.
- Discharges have risen by 15% in the past 10 days (from 178 to 205).

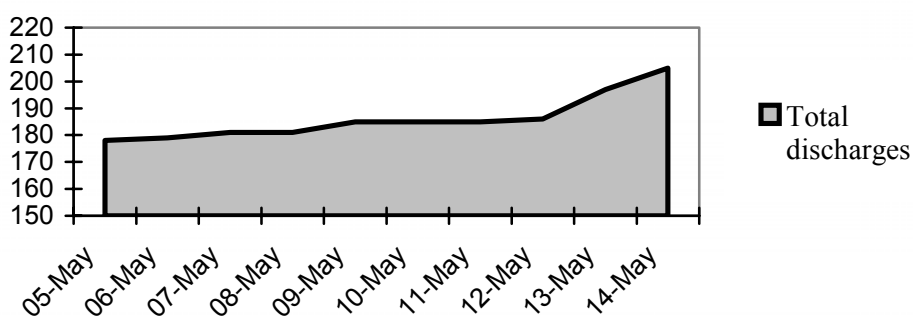
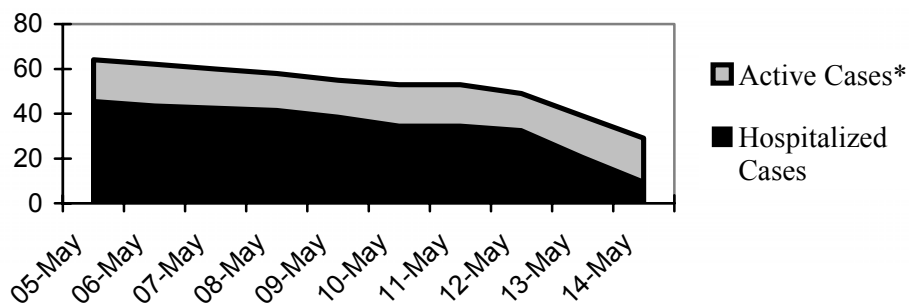
