The government of Ontario is committed to providing the information healthcare providers require in order to deliver the services needed to manage SARS. As part of these ongoing communications, the government is issuing a SARS bulletin on a regular basis to inform healthcare professionals of new directives and other pertinent information.

This bulletin provides an update on new directives and communications and does not replace or amend these documents.

DIRECTIVES

The following SARS directives were issued in recent days:

- A communiqué on personal protective equipment.
- A letter to all Acute Care Hospitals, in Toronto, York and Durham Regions on compliance.
- Questions and answers pertaining to income stabilization for physicians were posted on June 3rd on both the dedicated SARS website and the public Ministry website.
- A communiqué to non-acute care facilities was issued on June 3rd.

KEY SARS FACTS

- There are currently 60 active probable cases in hospital.
- GTA hospitals are advised to continue heightened infection control procedures and to follow mask fit testing procedures.

NEWS

- The WHO advised on June 11th that it is awaiting further information on cases in other countries that may have been exported from Toronto. The WHO stated that it is "not yet convinced that such cases have been conclusively documented."
- The WHO's international conference on SARS is scheduled for next week (June 17 and June 18) in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. The conference will include lessons learned from regions including Canada as well as sessions on epidemiology and clinical diagnosis and management.
