

Weekly Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three

Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

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This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending June 20, 2005

Higher prices in southern Ontario offset lower prices in the north, causing the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to increase by 0.8 cents to 89.0 cents, a two-month high.

Prices rose by 1.5 cents in Toronto (to a two-month high), 1.3 cents in London (to a two-month high), and 1.0 cents in Ottawa (to a three-month high). Prices fell by 5.1 cents in Thunder Bay, 4.3 cents in Sudbury, 2.0 cents in North Bay, 1.4 cents in Timmins (to a four-month low), 1.0 cents in Windsor, and 0.7 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to three-month low). Windsor remained the lowest-priced market for the tenth straight week. The average price gap between southern and northern Ontario narrowed from 5.0 cents to 0.6 cents, its lowest level since March 2002. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the third straight week, by 1.7 cents to 88.8 cents, a record high.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased by 1.6 cents to 91.9 cents, a two-month high. Prices rose by 7.5 cents in Montreal (to a 13-month high), 3.1 cents in Winnipeg (to a three-month high), 2.1 cents in Quebec City (to a 13-month high), and 1.9 cents in Vancouver. Prices fell by 2.0 cents in Regina and less than a cent in St. John's (to a two-month low), Toronto (from a two-month high), Saint John, and Calgary. The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the fourth straight week, by 1.9 cents to 90.7 cents, a record high.

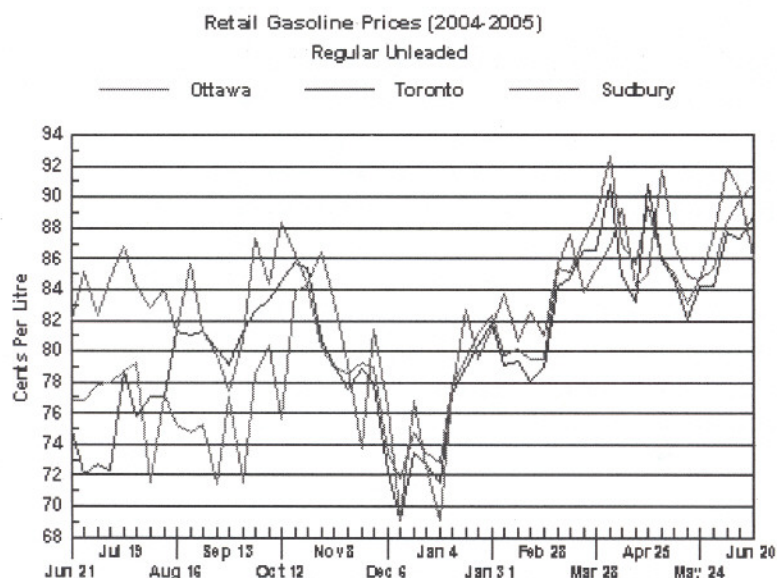
