This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending September 12, 2005

Sharply lower wholesale prices, reflecting the partial recovery of U.S. Gulf Coast refining operations and planned releases of emergency gasoline stockpiles, caused the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to decline by 20.5 cents from a record high to 109.1 cents a litre.

Prices fell by 24.7 cents in London, 22.7 cents in Toronto, 21.3 cents in Ottawa, 14.5 cents in Sudbury, 14.1 cents in North Bay, 11.6 cents in Sault Ste. Marie, 10.5 cents in Windsor, 6.6 cents in Timmins, and 0.4 cents in Thunder Bay, all from record highs. The average price gap between southern and northern Ontario widened sharply to a record high of 19.5 cents, reflecting the slower price decline in the north. The Ontario average retail diesel price, after increasing five straight weeks, declined by 2.5 cents from a record high to 99.5 cents.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price, after increasing two straight weeks, declined by 16.1 cents from a record high to 109.9 cents. Prices fell by 26.3 cents in St. John's, 26.1 cents in Toronto, 20.0 cents in Quebec City, 19.1 cents in Halifax, 18.0 cents in Montreal, 11.0 cents in Charlottetown, 10.0 cents in Saint John, 6.5 cents in Edmonton, 5.6 cents in Winnipeg, 4.3 cents in Regina, 4.0 cents in Calgary, and 2.5 cents in Vancouver, all from record highs. The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the second straight week, by 2.5 cents to 103.7 cents, a record high.

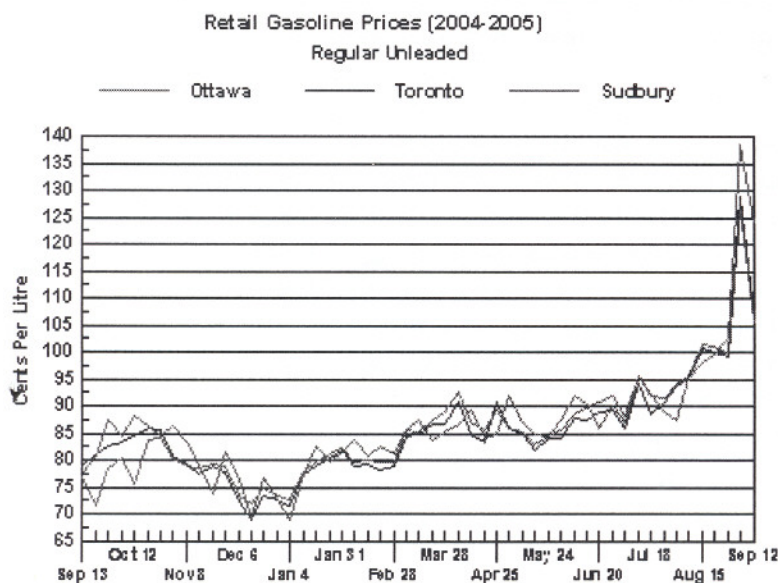
