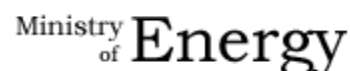


Weekly Gasoline Report



The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending October 24, 2005

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline declined for the third straight week, by 4.5 cents to 91.1 cents a litre, a three-month low, as wholesale prices continued to ease in response to the improving U.S. gasoline supply situation.

Prices fell by 10.6 cents in Windsor (to a three-month low), 7.1 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a three-month low), 6.0 cents in Ottawa (to a four-month low), 4.7 cents in North Bay (to a three-month low), 4.1 cents in Timmins (to a two-month low), 4.0 cents in Toronto West (to a three-month low), London (to a four-month low), and Thunder Bay (to a two-month low), 3.5 cents in Toronto East (to a three-month low), and 0.9 cents in Sudbury (to a two-month low). The average price gap between southern and northern Ontario widened slightly to 10.6 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined for the third straight week, by 2.2 cents to 99.8 cents.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price declined for the third straight week, by 4.8 cents to 92.8 cents, a four-month low. Prices fell by 10.7 cents in Charlottetown, 7.8 cents in Toronto, 5.9 cents in Halifax, 5.1 cents in Vancouver, 5.0 cents in Saint John, 4.2 cents in Quebec City, 4.1 cents in St. John's, 3.0 cents in Regina, 2.6 cents in Calgary, 2.3 cents in Winnipeg, 1.1 cents in Montreal, and 0.8 cents in Edmonton. Prices in these markets were all at three-month lows with the exception of Vancouver's (which were at a seven-month low) and Quebec City's (which were at a four-month low). The Canadian average retail diesel price rose by 1.4 cents to 107.6 cents, a record high.

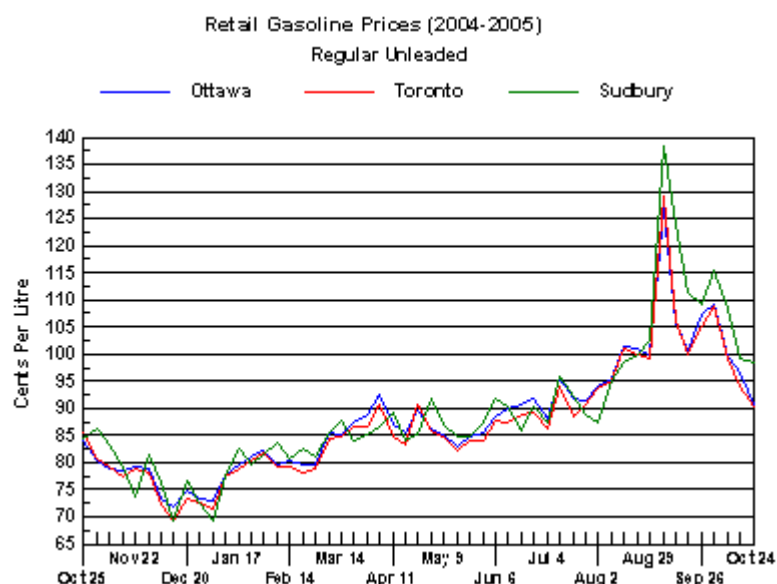
