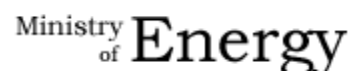


Weekly Gasoline Report



The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending November 14, 2005

Lower wholesale prices and price war activity in some markets caused the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to decline for the sixth straight week, by 2.3 cents to 86.3 cents a litre, a six-month low.

Prices fell by 4.3 cents in Thunder Bay (to a six-month low), 3.4 cents in Timmins (to a four-month low), 3.2 cents in Ottawa (to a six-month low), 2.5 cents in Toronto East (to a six-month low), 2.3 cents in Toronto West (to a four-month low) and Windsor (to a six-month low), and 2.1 cents in London (to a six-month low). Prices rose by 3.5 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (from a ten-month low), 2.8 cents in Sudbury (from a three-month low), and 0.2 cents in North Bay (from a six-month low). Windsor was the lowest-priced market for the fourth straight week. The average price gap between southern and northern Ontario widened by 2.3 cents from a three-month low to 5.5 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined for the sixth straight week, by 1.8 cents to 95.2 cents, a three-month low.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price declined by 2.9 cents to 88.1 cents, a six-month low. Prices fell by 10.3 cents in Montreal (to an eight-month low), 3.5 cents in Edmonton (to a six-month low), 1.6 cents in Winnipeg (to a five-month low), 1.5 cents in St. John's (to a five-month low), 1.2 cents in Toronto (to a six-month low), 1.1 cents in Vancouver, 1.0 cents in Halifax (to a six-month low), and less than a cent in Saint John (to a six-month low) and Calgary (to an eight-month low). The Canadian average retail diesel price declined for the third straight week, by 2.4 cents to 101.6 cents, a seven-week low.

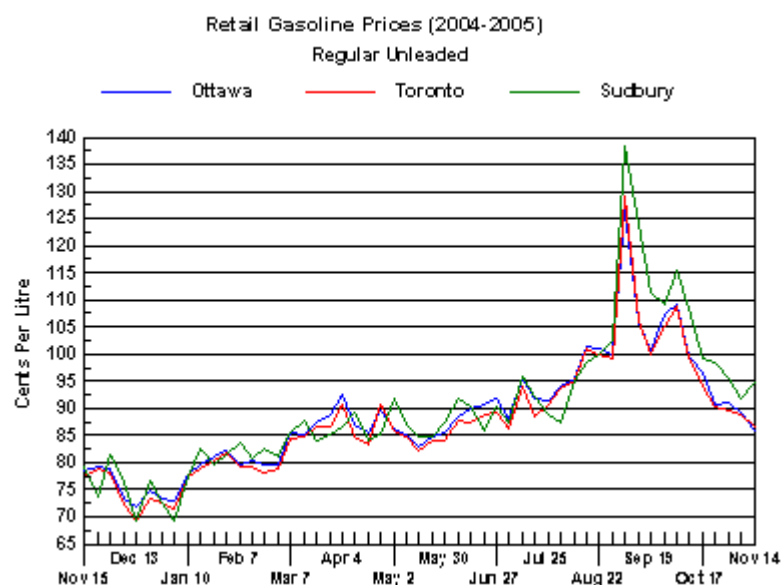
