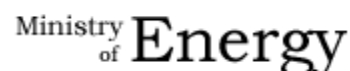


Weekly Gasoline Report



The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending November 21, 2005

Despite lower wholesale prices, the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline, after declining six straight weeks, remained unchanged at a six-month low of 86.3 cents a litre.

Prices fell by 4.1 cents in Sudbury (to a four-month low), 3.8 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a ten-month low), 2.4 cents in North Bay (to a six-month low), and less than a cent in Ottawa (to a six-month low), London (to a six-month low), Toronto East (to a six-month low), and Timmins (to a five-month low). Prices rose by 3.4 cents in Thunder Bay (from a six-month low), 1.6 cents in Windsor (from a six-month low), and 0.2 cents in Toronto West (from a four-month low). Windsor was the lowest-priced market for the fifth straight week. The average price gap between southern and northern Ontario narrowed from 5.5 cents to 4.4 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined for the seventh straight week, by 1.4 cents to 93.8 cents, a three-month low.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased by 0.2 cents from a six-month low to 88.3 cents. Prices rose by 5.1 cents in Montreal (from an eight-month low), but fell by 8.1 cents in Edmonton (to a ten-month low), 6.1 cents in Saint John (to a nine-month low), 4.0 cents in Regina (to a nine-month low), 2.9 cents in Vancouver (to an eight-month low), 2.1 cents in Quebec City (to a six-month low), 1.5 cents in Winnipeg (to a five-month low), and less than a cent in Calgary (to an eight-month low) and Toronto (to a six-month low). The Canadian average retail diesel price declined for the fourth straight week, by 1.9 cents to 99.7 cents, a three-month low.

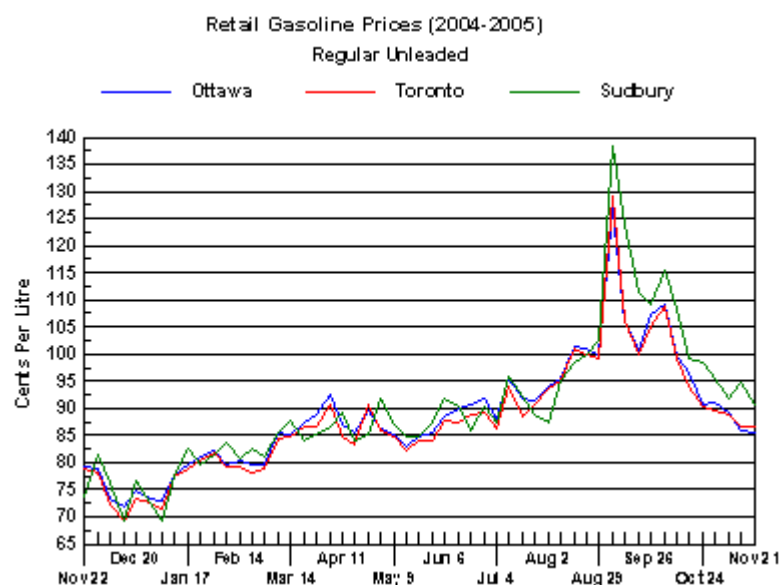
