

Weekly Gasoline Report



The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three

Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

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This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending January 16, 2006

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline, after increasing four straight weeks, declined by 5.7 cents from a three-month high to 93.0 cents a litre, reflecting lower wholesale prices.

Prices fell by 7.2 cents in London, 6.8 cents in Toronto, 5.5 cents in Ottawa, 4.4 cents in Windsor, 3.2 cents in Sault Ste. Marie, and 1.6 cents in Sudbury, all from three-month highs. Prices rose by 3.6 cents in Thunder Bay and 1.9 cents in North Bay, both to three-month highs. The average price gap between southern and northern Ontario widened from 0.5 cents to 7.1 cents, a three-month high. The Ontario average retail diesel price, after increasing four straight weeks, declined by 2.2 cents from a two-month high to 93.3 cents, a four-week low.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price, after increasing four straight weeks, declined by 4.0 cents from a three-month high to 93.7 cents. Prices fell by 7.8 cents in Montreal (from a three-month high), 4.6 cents in Toronto, 3.0 cents in Halifax (from a three-month high) and Winnipeg (from a two-month high), 2.2 cents in Saint John (from a three-month high), 1.9 cents in Calgary (from a two-month high), 1.7 cents in Vancouver (from a two-month high), and less than a cent in Quebec City (from a three-month high) and Edmonton (from a two-month high). Prices rose by 3.3 cents in Charlottetown, 1.5 cents in St. John's, and 0.2 cents in Regina, all to three-month highs. The Canadian average retail diesel price declined by 1.0 cents from a six-week high to 95.9 cents.

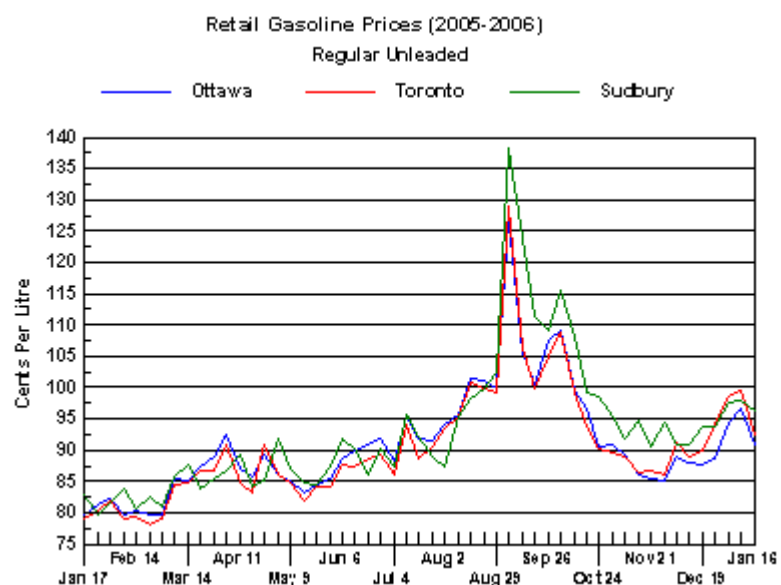
