This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending April 10, 2006

Higher wholesale prices, reflecting concerns about U.S. gasoline supplies this summer and crude oil price increases resulting from tensions in some oil-producing countries, caused the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to increase for the second straight week, by 1.4 cents to 102.0 cents a litre, a six-month high.

Prices rose by 4.5 cents in Sudbury, 3.0 cents in Windsor, 2.1 cents in Thunder Bay, 1.8 cents in Ottawa, 1.2 cents in North Bay, 1.1 cents in Toronto West, 1.0 cents in London, and less than a cent in Sault Ste. Marie and Toronto East. Prices in all of these markets were at six-month highs except in Windsor, where they were at a three-month high. Windsor was the lowest-priced market for the third straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario widened slightly to 3.0 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the second straight week, by 1.4 cents to 96.4 cents, a five-month high.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the eighth straight week, by 2.2 cents to 104.1 cents, a six-month high. Prices rose by 4.1 cents in Saint John, 4.0 cents in Halifax, 3.7 cents in Toronto, 1.8 cents in St. John's, 1.7 cents in Vancouver, 1.2 cents in Montreal, and 0.7 cents in Calgary, all to six-month highs. The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the seventh straight week, by 0.5 cents to 97.8 cents, a five-month high.

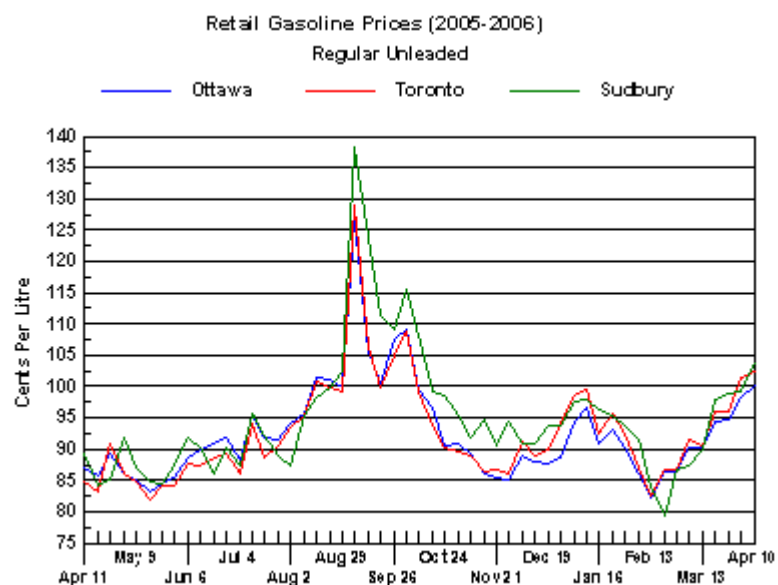
