This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending April 17, 2006

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline increased for the third straight week, by 2.4 cents to 104.4 cents a litre, a six-month high, as world crude oil prices touched record highs and wholesale gasoline prices continued their upward climb.

Prices rose by 5.3 cents in North Bay, 5.1 cents in London, 5.0 cents in Timmins, 3.9 cents in Sault Ste. Marie, 3.7 cents in Ottawa, 3.1 cents in Windsor, 1.7 cents in Toronto, and 1.1 cents in Sudbury, all to six-month highs. Prices fell by 1.0 cents in Thunder Bay (from a six-month high). Windsor was the lowest-priced market for the fourth straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario narrowed slightly to 2.6 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the third straight week, by 1.2 cents to 97.6 cents, a six-month high.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the ninth straight week, by 3.8 cents to 107.9 cents, a six-month high. Prices rose by 7.0 cents in Montreal, 5.2 cents in St. John's, 5.0 cents in Quebec City, 4.8 cents in Calgary and Charlottetown, 4.0 cents in Regina, 3.5 cents in Edmonton, 2.7 cents in Toronto and Saint John, 2.2 cents in Vancouver, and 1.3 cents in Winnipeg. Prices in all these markets were at six-month highs except Edmonton's, which were at a seven-month high. Prices fell by 1.4 cents in Halifax (from a six-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the eighth straight week, by 1.5 cents to 99.3 cents, a five-month high.

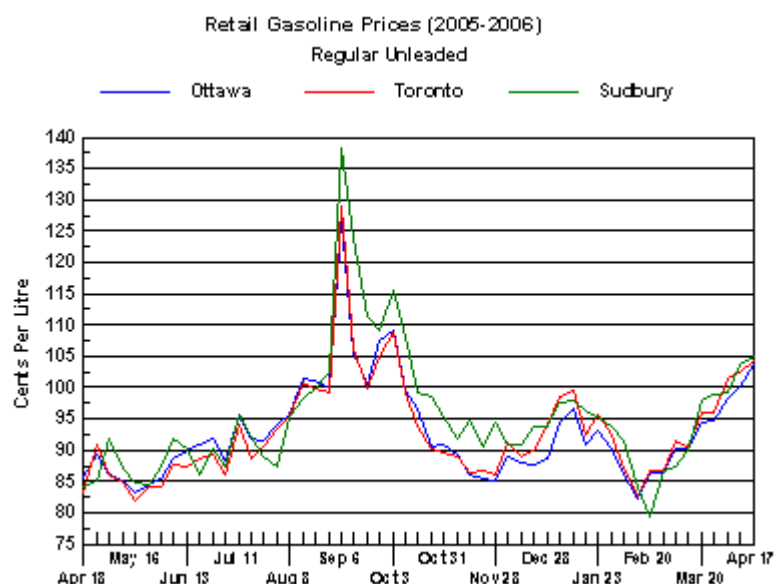
