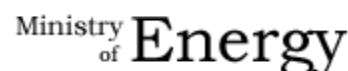


Weekly Gasoline Report



The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending August 21, 2006

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline declined for the second straight week, by 2.6 cents to 99.0 cents a litre, a three-month low, reflecting lower wholesale prices and price wars in some markets.

Prices fell by 9.3 cents in Windsor (to a five-month low), 5.4 cents in Sudbury (to a two-month low), 5.3 cents in North Bay (to a two-month low), 4.7 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a two-month low), 2.6 cents in Toronto East (to a five-month low), 2.5 cents in Timmins (to a four-week low), 2.2 cents in Toronto West (to a three-month low), 1.9 cents in Ottawa (to a two-month low), and 0.7 cents in London (to a two-month low). Prices rose by 0.1 cents in Thunder Bay (to an eleven-month high). The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario, after widening four straight weeks, narrowed to 12.6 cents from an eleven-month high of 13.3 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined for the second straight week, by 0.7 cents to 101.3 cents.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price declined for the third straight week, by 3.7 cents to 103.0 cents, a five-month low. Prices fell by 10.5 cents from a four-month high in Saint John (to a two-month low), 9.6 cents in St. John's (to a four-month low), 8.6 cents in Montreal (to a five-month low), 8.0 cents in Quebec City (to a two-month low), 6.5 cents in Edmonton (to a two-month low), 4.4 cents in Winnipeg (to a six-week low), 4.3 cents in Regina (to a four-week low) and Calgary (to a two-month low), 1.8 cents in Vancouver (to a two-month low), and 1.0 cents in Toronto (to a five-month low). The Canadian average retail diesel price, after increasing six straight weeks, declined by 1.1 cents from a ten-month high to 106.4 cents.

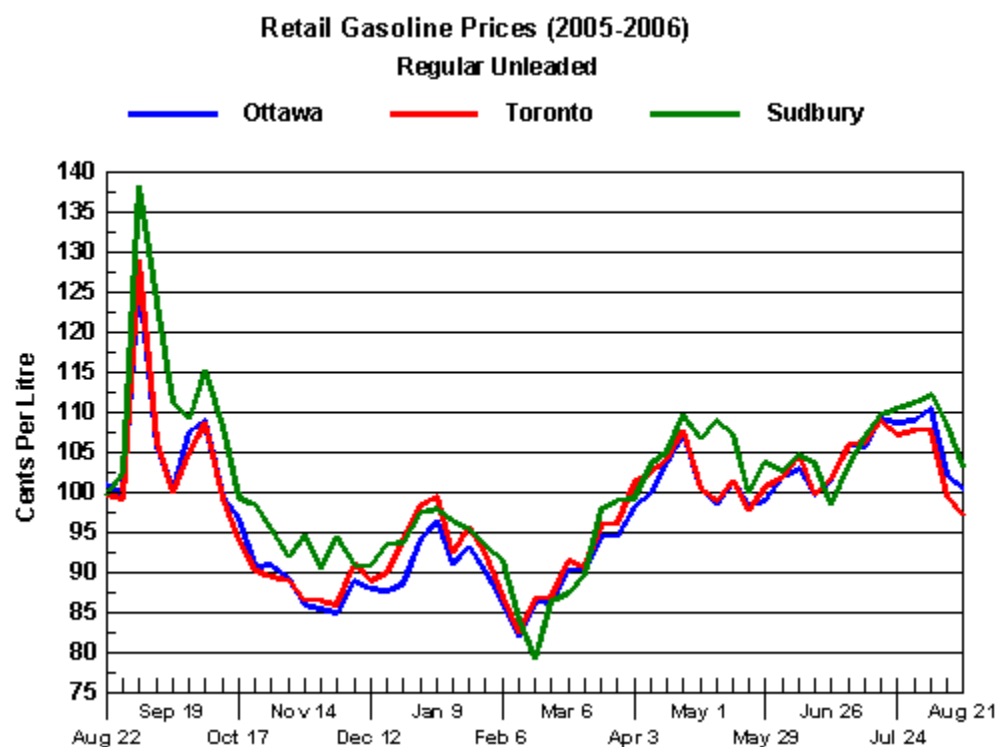
