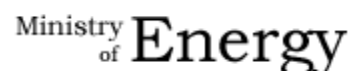


Weekly Gasoline Report



The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending August 28, 2006

Lower wholesale prices and price war activity in some markets caused the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to decline for the third straight week, by 4.2 cents to 94.8 cents a litre, a six-month low.

Prices fell by 6.2 cents in Toronto West (to a six-month low), 6.0 cents in North Bay (to a five-month low), 5.7 cents in Sudbury (to a six-month low), 4.2 cents in London (to a six-month low), 3.6 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a two-month low), 3.5 cents in Ottawa (to a five-month low), 3.1 cents in Toronto East (to a six-month low), 3.0 cents from an eleven-month high in Thunder Bay (to a six-week low), 3.0 cents in Timmins (to a two-month low), and 1.4 cents in Windsor (to a five-month low). Windsor had the lowest average price for the second straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario was unchanged at 12.6 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined for the third straight week, by 1.2 cents to 100.1 cents, a five-week low.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price declined for the fourth straight week, by 6.1 cents to 96.9 cents, a six-month low. Prices fell by 8.0 cents in Vancouver (to a five-month low), 7.9 cents in Regina (to a five-month low), 7.3 cents in Winnipeg (to a five-month low), 6.7 cents in Toronto (to a six-month low), 6.5 cents in Calgary (to a five-month low), 6.4 cents in Edmonton (to a two-month low), 6.0 cents in Quebec City (to a six-month low), 5.2 cents in Charlottetown (to a five-month low), 4.1 cents in Montreal (to a six-month low), 3.6 cents in Halifax (to a two-month low), and 3.1 cents in Saint John (to a six-month low). The Canadian average retail diesel price declined for the second straight week, by 0.7 cents to 105.7 cents, a four-week low.

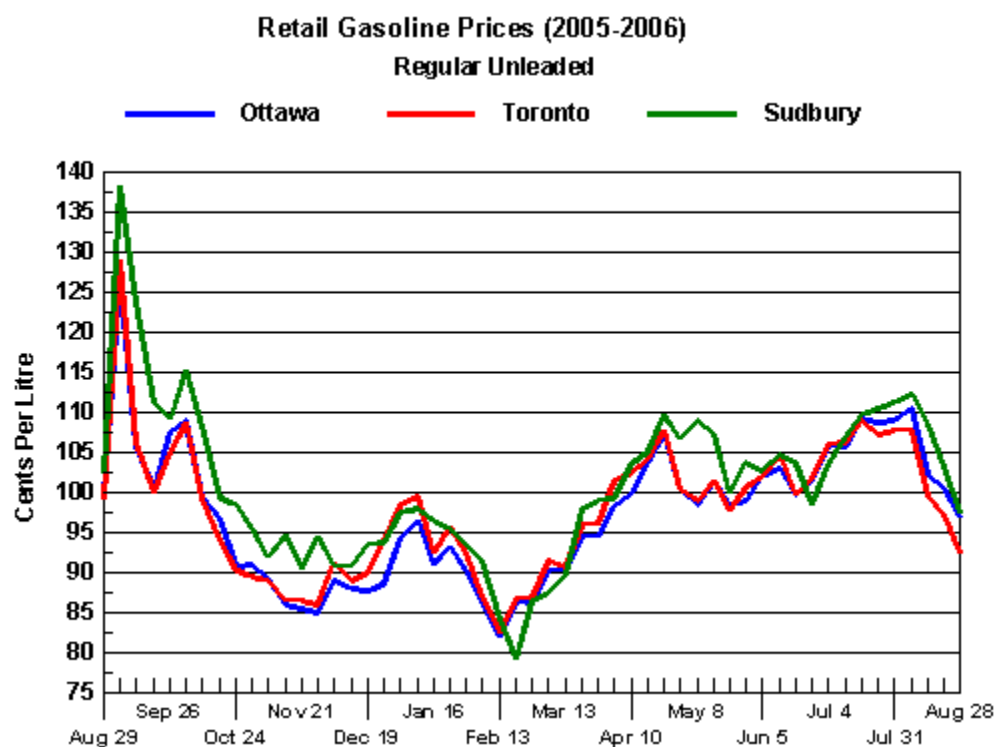
