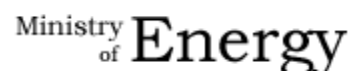


Weekly Gasoline Report



The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending September 5, 2006

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline declined for the fourth straight week, by 4.5 cents to 90.3 cents a litre, a six-month low, as wholesale prices continued to fall and price wars occurred in some markets.

Prices fell by 9.4 cents in Sault Ste. Marie, 9.2 cents in Thunder Bay, 8.0 cents in Timmins, 7.6 cents in North Bay, 7.2 cents in Sudbury, 4.8 cents in Toronto East and London, 4.5 cents in Ottawa, 3.4 cents in Toronto West, and 1.7 cents in Windsor. Prices were at six-month lows in all markets except Thunder Bay (where they were at a four-month low) and Timmins (where they were at a five-month low). The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario narrowed from 12.6 cents to 8.3 cents, a four-week low. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined for the fourth straight week, by 0.2 cents to 99.9 cents, a six-week low.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price declined for the fifth straight week, by 2.8 cents to 94.1 cents, a six-month low. Prices fell by 9.3 cents in Calgary, 8.8 cents in Charlottetown, 7.8 cents in Winnipeg, 7.5 cents in Halifax, 7.2 cents in Regina, 5.0 cents in Edmonton, 4.0 cents in St. John's, 3.2 cents in Vancouver, 2.5 cents in Saint John, 2.0 cents in Quebec City, and 0.3 cents in Montreal and Toronto. Prices were at six-month lows in all markets except Edmonton and Charlottetown, where they were at five-month lows. The Canadian average retail diesel price declined for the third straight week, by 2.0 cents to 103.7 cents, a six-week low.

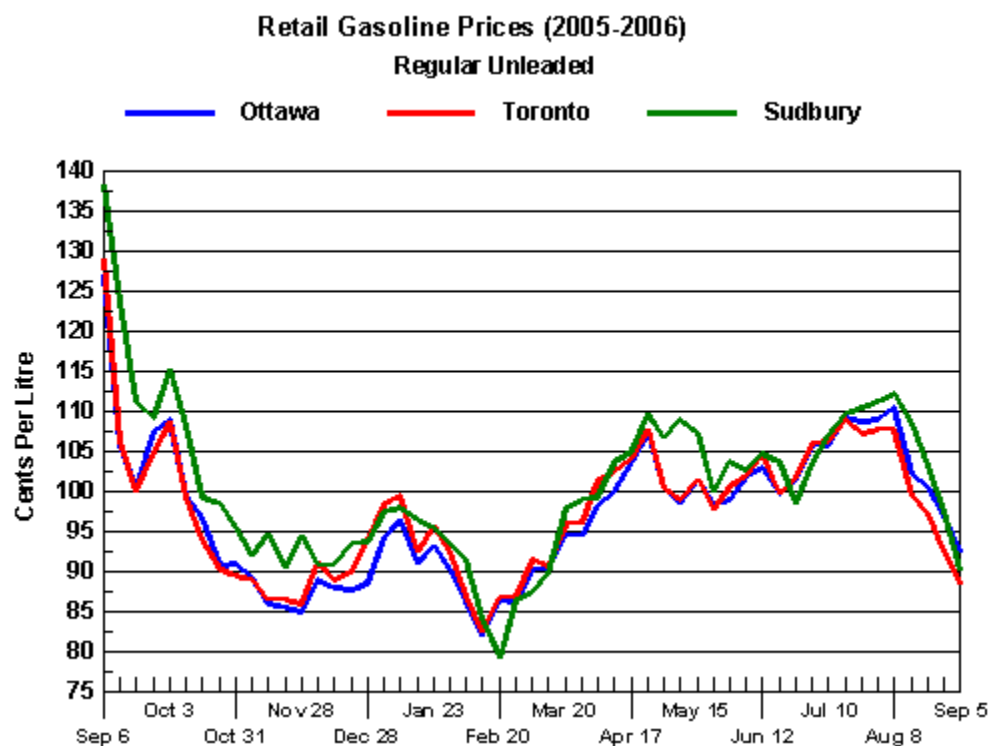
