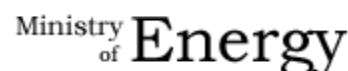


Weekly Gasoline Report



The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending September 18, 2006

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline declined for the sixth straight week, by 1.1 cents to 85.3 cents a litre, a seven-month low, as previous wholesale price declines flowed through to the pump in northern markets.

Prices fell by 9.2 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a 20-month low), 7.6 cents in Sudbury (to a seven-month low), 7.4 cents in Thunder Bay (to a six-month low), 6.6 cents in North Bay (to a nine-month low), 3.3 cents in Timmins (to a six-month low), 1.9 cents in London (to a seven-month low), and less than a cent in Windsor, Toronto, and Ottawa (all to seven-month lows). The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario narrowed sharply from 10.7 cents to 3.9 cents, a three-month low. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined for the sixth straight week, by 4.3 cents to 93.8 cents, a six-month low.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price, after declining six straight weeks, was unchanged at a seven-month low of 90.2 cents. Prices rose by 4.8 cents in Montreal (from a seven-month low) and less than a cent in Toronto (from a seven-month low), Halifax (from a seven-month low), and Vancouver (from a six-month low). Prices fell by 7.7 cents in Edmonton (to a seven-month low), 5.9 cents in Quebec City (to a 19-month low) and St. John's (to a six-month low), 5.4 cents in Charlottetown (to a six-month low) and Calgary (to a seven-month low), 4.0 cents in Regina (to a six-month low), 3.4 cents in Winnipeg (to a six-month low), and 2.3 cents in Saint John (to a seven-month low). The Canadian average retail diesel price declined for the fifth straight week, by 3.9 cents to 97.1 cents, a six-month low.

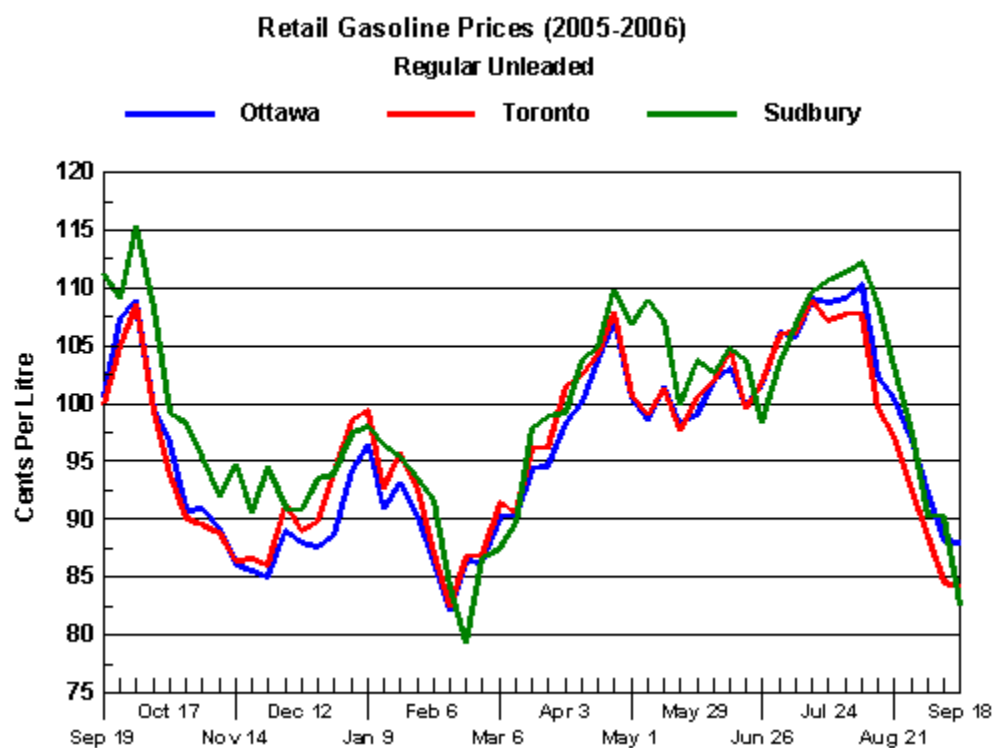
