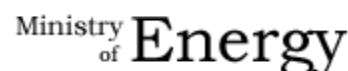


Weekly Gasoline Report



The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending November 20, 2006

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline increased for the second straight week, by 0.6 cents to 85.5 cents a litre, a two-month high, as earlier wholesale price increases were passed through to the pump.

Prices rose by 2.3 cents in Windsor (to a five-week high), 1.3 cents in London (to a two-month high), and less than a cent in Ottawa (to a two-month high), Toronto East (to a two-month high), Sault Ste. Marie (from a four-week low), and Toronto West (to a six-week high). Prices fell by less than a cent in Sudbury and North Bay (the latter to a two-month low). Windsor had the lowest average price for the ninth straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario narrowed for the fourth straight week, from 4.2 cents to 3.3 cents, a two-month low. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined by 0.4 cents to 87.0 cents.

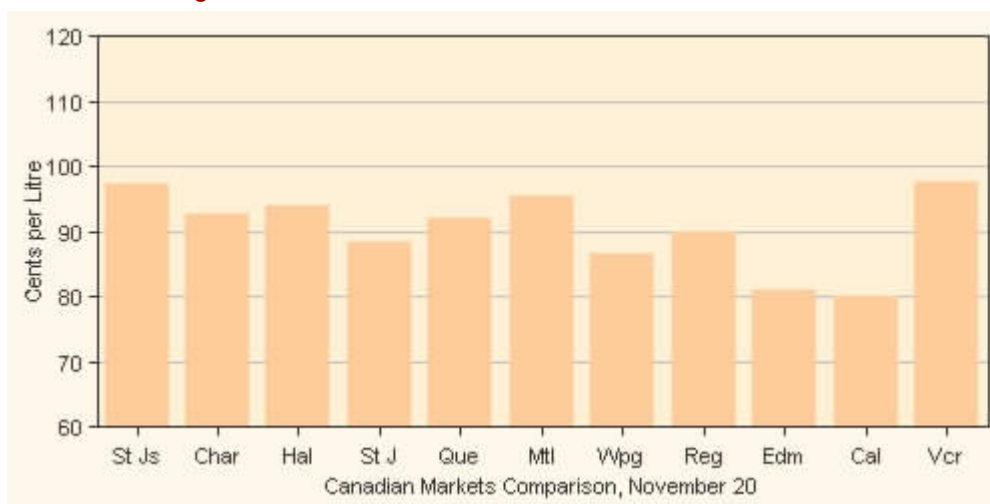
The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the third straight week, by 1.4 to 89.5 cents, a two-month high. Prices rose by 5.9 cents from a 21-month low in Quebec City (to a two-month high), 4.0 cents from a nine-month low in Halifax (to a two-month high), 3.0 cents in Montreal and Charlottetown (both to two-month highs), 2.1 cents in Toronto (to a two-month high), and 0.3 cents in St. John's (to a six-week high). Prices fell by 1.2 cents in Vancouver (from a six-week high), 1.0 cents in Saint John (from a six-week high), and 0.2 cents in Calgary (to an 11-month low) and Edmonton (from a two-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price declined by 0.7 cents to 88.7 cents, a 17-month low.

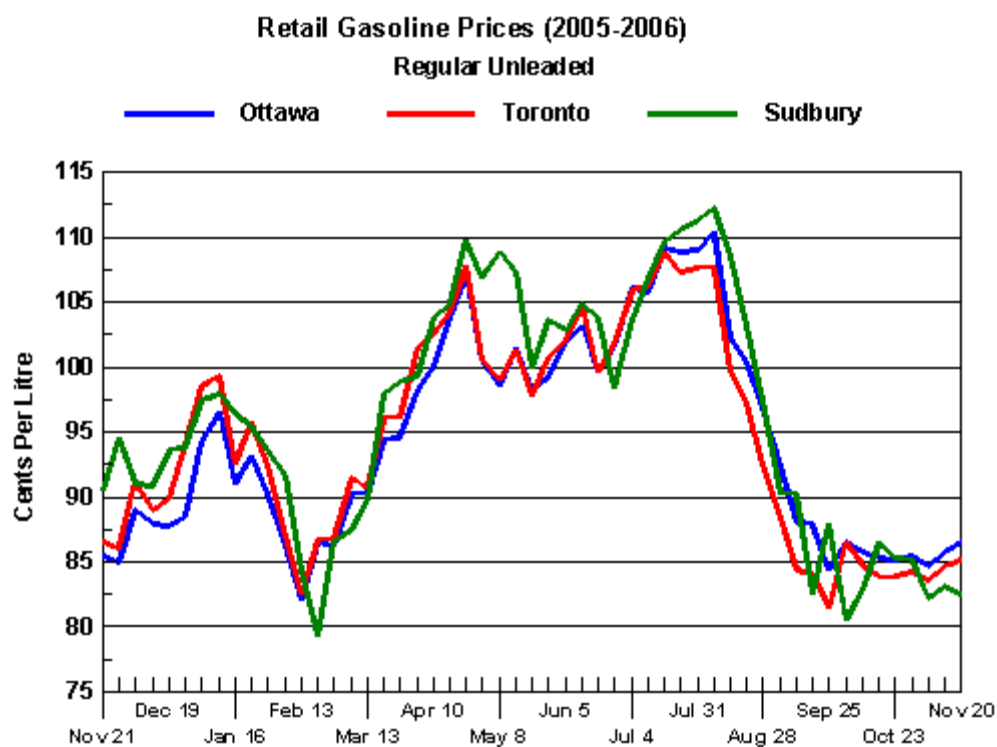
