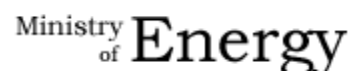


Weekly Gasoline Report



The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending December 4, 2006

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline increased for the fourth straight week, by 2.3 cents to 89.3 cents a litre, a three-month high, on the strength of higher world crude oil and North American wholesale gasoline prices.

Prices rose by 3.7 cents in Toronto West (to a three-month high), 3.6 cents in Windsor (from a nine-month low), 3.4 cents in Sudbury (to a three-month high), 3.1 cents in North Bay (to a three-month high), 2.1 cents in Ottawa (to a three-month high), 1.9 cents in London (to a three-month high), and 1.6 cents in Toronto East (to a three-month high). Prices fell by 3.2 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (from a three-month high) and 0.8 cents in Thunder Bay (from a two-month high). Windsor had the lowest average price for the eleventh straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario narrowed from a two-month high of 6.1 cents to 4.0 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the second straight week, by 1.2 cents to 88.4 cents, a five-week high.

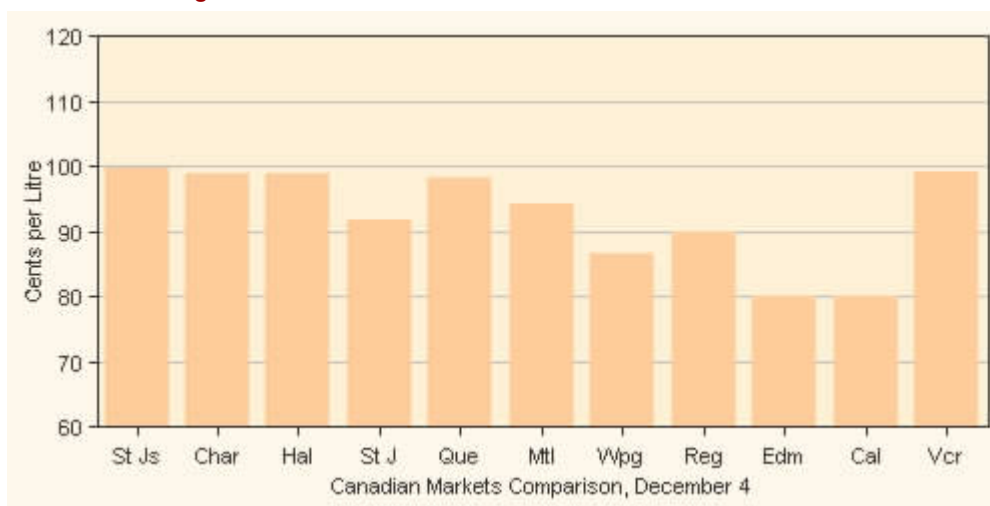
The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased by 1.5 cents to 90.8 cents, a three-month high. Prices increased by 6.1 cents in Quebec City (to a three-month high), 6.0 cents in Charlottetown (to a three-month high), 4.9 cents in Halifax (to a three-month high), 3.3 cents in Saint John (to a three-month high), 2.0 cents in Montreal, 1.9 cents in Toronto (to a three-month high), and 1.1 cents in Vancouver (to a two-month high). Prices fell by less than a cent in Edmonton (to a four-week low) and Calgary. The Canadian average retail diesel price, after declining two straight weeks, increased by 0.9 cents from an 18-month low to 89.3 cents.

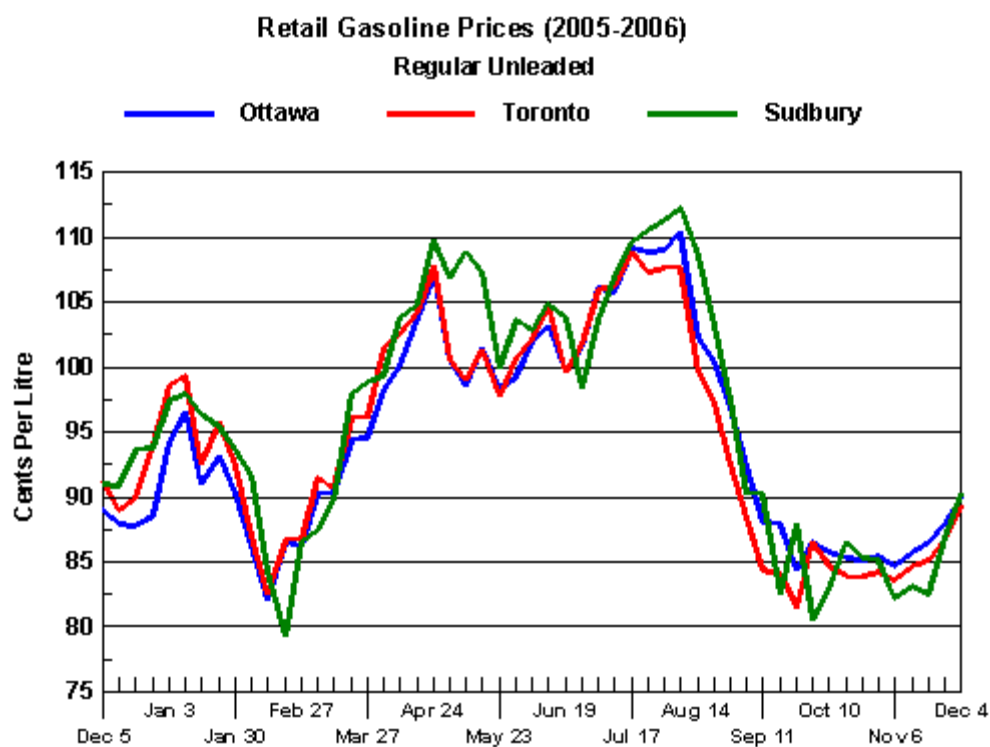
