

Weekly Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending February 26, 2006

Petroleum refining and other supply issues in Ontario helped boost the provincial average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline for the fifth straight week, by 5.4 cents to 97.2 cents a litre, a six-month high.

Prices rose by 12.6 cents in Sudbury, 11.8 cents in North Bay, 9.7 cents in Timmins, 6.2 cents in London, 5.6 cents in Windsor, 5.5 cents in Toronto, 4.7 cents in Sault Ste. Marie, 3.4 cents in Ottawa, and 0.2 cents in Thunder Bay. Prices in all of these markets were at a six-month high except in Thunder Bay, where they were at a six-week high. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario widened from a two-month low of 1.7 cents to 3.5 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the fourth straight week, by 2.9 cents to 93.2 cents, a five-month high.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the fifth straight week, by 5.9 cents to 98.1 cents, a six-month high. Prices rose by 11.1 cents in Montreal (to a six-month high), 7.5 cents in Halifax (to a six-month high), 7.4 cents in Quebec City (to a two-month high), 6.2 cents in Toronto (to a seven-month high), 3.8 cents in Calgary (to a six-month high), 3.5 cents in Edmonton (to a six-month high), 3.4 cents in both Regina (to a six-month high) and Saint John (to a two-month high), 3.1 cents in Winnipeg (to a six-month high), and 0.4 cents in Vancouver (to a two-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the fourth straight week, by 2.5 cents to 96.4 cents, a two-month high.

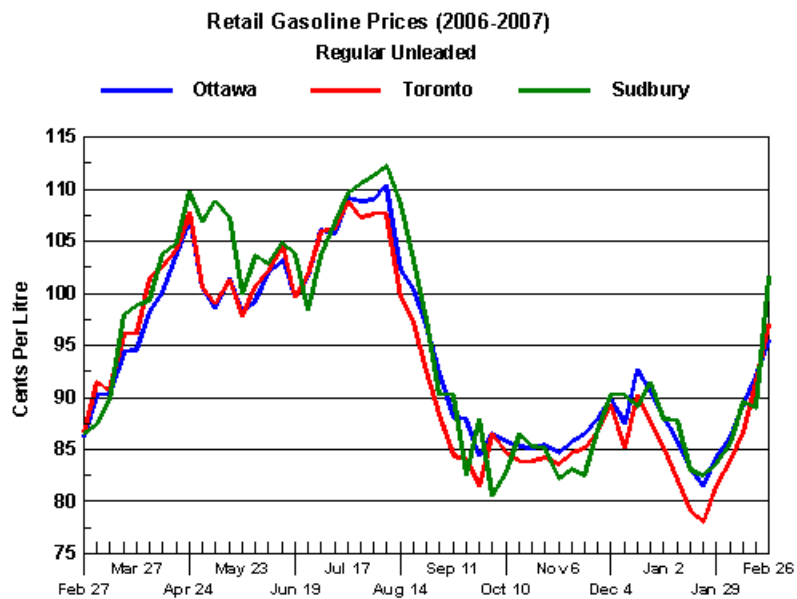
