

## Weekly Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending June 4, 2006

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**Lower wholesale prices and renewed price war activity in some markets caused the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to decline for the second straight week, by 2.5 cents to 106.1 cents a litre, a four-week low.**

Prices fell by 5.0 cents from a 20-month high in Windsor (to a four-week low), 4.5 cents from a 21-month high in Thunder Bay, 2.4 cents in Toronto (to a four-week low), 2.3 cents in Ottawa (to a four-week low), 2.0 cents in London (to a four-week low), 1.6 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (from a 21-month high), 1.3 cents in both Sudbury and North Bay, and 0.5 cents in Timmins. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario widened for the third straight week, from 8.6 cents to 8.9 cents, a four-month high. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined for the second straight week, by 0.9 cents to 94.1 cents, a three-month low.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price declined for the second straight week, by 5.3 cents to 108.2 cents, a four-week low. Prices fell by 8.0 cents in both Montreal (to a six-week low) and Edmonton (to a four-week low), 6.3 cents in Calgary (to a four-week low), 5.9 cents in Vancouver (to a two-month low), 5.0 cents from a record high in Regina (to a four-week low), 5.0 cents from a ten-month high in Quebec City (to a five-week low), 4.2 cents in Toronto (to a four-week low), 3.4 cents in Halifax (to a five-week low), 2.7 cents in Saint John (from a nine-month high), 2.2 cents in Winnipeg, and 1.9 cents in Charlottetown (to a four-week low). The Canadian average retail diesel price declined for the second straight week, by 0.1 cents to 97.1 cents.

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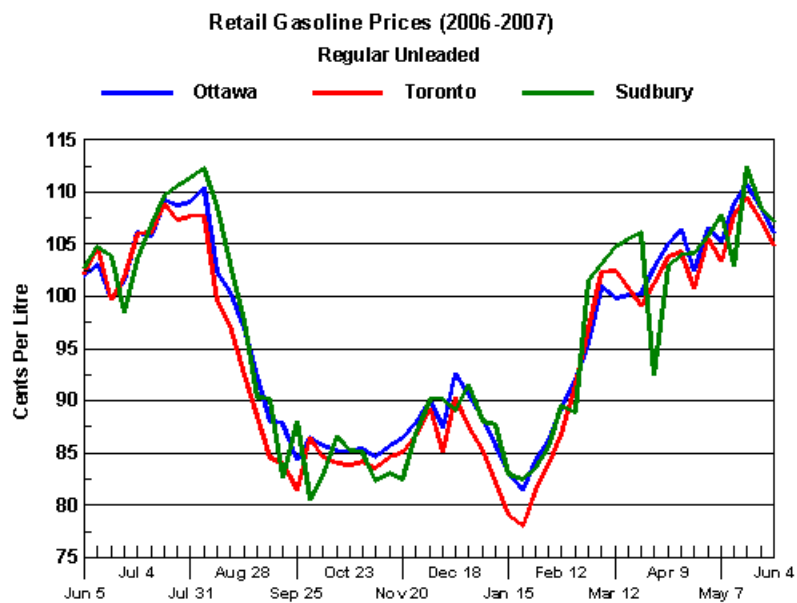
