

Weekly Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending June 25, 2006

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline declined by 0.4 cents to 104.7 cents a litre, as wholesale prices edged down slightly and pump price competition heated up in Windsor.

Prices fell by 5.1 cents in Windsor (to a four-month low), 1.3 cents in Thunder Bay (to a five-week low), and less than a cent in Timmins (to a two-month low), London, Toronto, and Ottawa. Prices rose by 2.7 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (from a two-month low), 1.8 cents in North Bay, and 1.3 cents in Sudbury. Windsor had the lowest average price for the second straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario, after narrowing two straight weeks, widened to 5.0 cents from a four-week low of 3.8 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased by 1.2 cents from a four-month low to 94.4 cents, a four-week high. In the second quarter of 2007, the Ontario regular gasoline price averaged 105.2 cents, up 3.1 cents from the same period in 2006, and the Ontario diesel price averaged 95.5 cents, down 3.6 cents.

For the week, the Canadian average retail gasoline price declined by 1.2 cents to 105.9 cents. Prices fell by 5.8 cents in Montreal (to a four-month low), 5.4 cents in Quebec City (to a four-month low), 2.6 cents in St. Johns (to a three-month low), and 0.8 cents in Toronto. Prices rose by 3.3 cents in Saint John (from a two-month low), 3.2 cents in Halifax (from a three-month low), 1.5 cents in Vancouver, and 0.4 cents in Calgary (from a two-month low). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased by 1.7 cents from a four-month low to 97.6 cents, a two-month high. In the second quarter of 2007, the Canadian regular gasoline price averaged 108.4 cents, up 2.6 cents from the same period in 2006, and the Canadian diesel price averaged 98.2 cents, down 3.2 cents.

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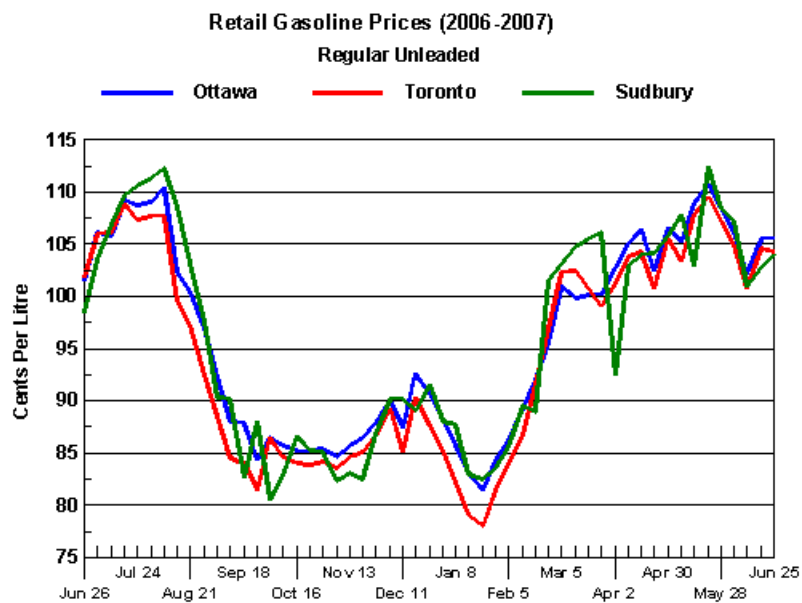
