

Weekly Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending July 9, 2006

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline, after declining two straight weeks, increased by 1.5 cents to 105.2 cents a litre, a five-week high, reflecting the end of price wars in some markets and slightly higher wholesale prices.

Prices rose by 6.0 cents from a two-month low in Timmins (to a 21-month high), 4.9 cents in Windsor (to a five-week high), 4.6 cents in Thunder Bay (to a five-week high), 4.3 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a five-week high), 4.1 cents in Sudbury and North Bay (both to a six-week high), 1.1 cents in Toronto, and less than a cent in Ottawa and London. Despite the increase, Windsor had the lowest average price for the fourth straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario widened for the third straight week, from 6.7 cents to 10.0 cents, a six-month high. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the third straight week, by 0.3 cents to 94.8 cents, a six-week high.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price, after declining two straight weeks, increased by 3.6 cents to 109.4 cents, a six-week high. Prices rose by 10.4 cents in Montreal (to a six-week high), 4.5 cents in Edmonton (to a five-week high), 4.2 cents in Regina (to a five-week high), 2.9 cents in Calgary (to a five-week high), 2.1 cents in Toronto (to a six-week high), 1.3 cents in Vancouver (to a six-week high), and 1.2 cents in St. Johns. Prices fell by less than a cent in Saint John and Winnipeg (the latter to a two-month low). The Canadian average retail diesel price was unchanged at a two-month high of 97.9 cents.

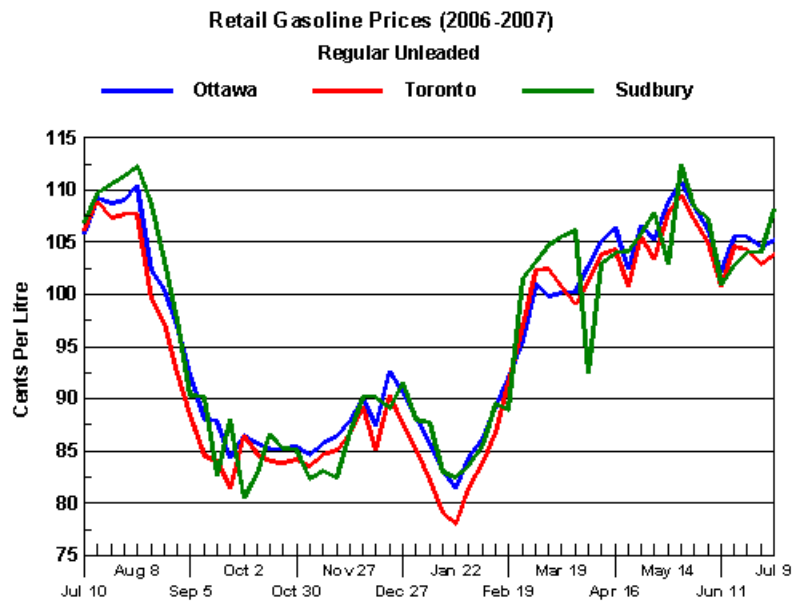
