

Weekly Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending November 26, 2006

Higher wholesale prices, boosted by record crude oil prices of over \$99 a barrel, caused the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to increase by 2.9 cents to 105.7 cents a litre, a six-month high.

Prices rose by 5.6 cents in both Sault Ste. Marie (to a four-month high) and North Bay (to a six-month high), 5.5 cents in Windsor (to a four-month high), 3.0 cents in both London (to a six-month high) and Timmins (to a four-month high), 2.8 cents in Toronto (to a six-month high), 2.5 cents in Ottawa (to a six-month high), and 2.1 cents in Sudbury. Windsor had the lowest average price for the fourth straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario narrowed slightly to 4.7 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the seventh straight week, by 3.3 cents to 105.0 cents, a record high.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the fifth straight week, by 3.1 cents to 107.8 cents, a five-month high. Prices rose by 10.8 cents in Montreal (to a six-month high), 7.0 cents in Quebec City (to a six-month high), 3.4 cents in Halifax (to a four-month high), 2.5 cents in Vancouver (to a five-month high), 2.2 cents in St. Johns (to a four-month high), 1.4 cents in Toronto (to a five-month high), 1.0 cents in Saint John (to a four-month high), and 0.1 cents in Calgary. Prices fell by 0.9 cents in Winnipeg (from a two-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the seventh straight week, by 3.6 cents to 112.3 cents, a record high.

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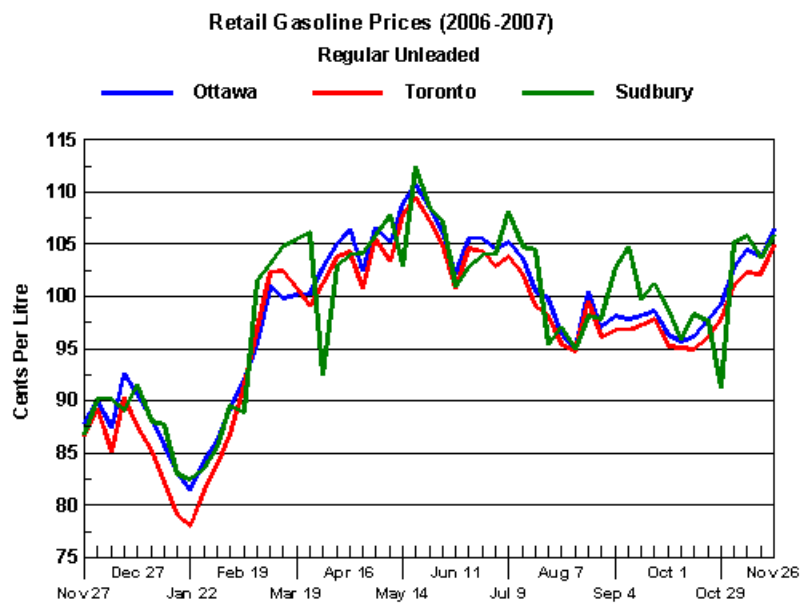
