

## Weekly Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending June 2, 2008

**The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline increased for the second straight week, by 0.7 cents to 128.1 cents a litre, a 33-month high, reflecting higher North American wholesale prices.**

Prices rose by 7.3 cents in Sault Ste. Marie, 4.2 cents in both Sudbury and North Bay, 3.0 cents in Timmins, and less than a cent in Toronto, London, and Windsor, all to a 33-month high. In Thunder Bay, prices rose by 2.5 cents to a record 134.7 cents, and in Ottawa they rose by 0.1 cents to a record 127.1 cents. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario widened from a seven-month low of 1.9 cents to a two-month high of 5.8 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price, after increasing three straight weeks, declined by 0.7 cents from a record high to 139.7 cents.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price declined by 1.5 cents from a record high to 131.1 cents. Prices fell by 11.7 cents in Montreal and 0.1 cents in Vancouver, both from a record high. Prices rose by 4.4 cents in Saint John (to a record 132.5 cents), 4.0 cents in Regina (to a record 135.9 cents), 3.0 cents in both Winnipeg (to a record 129.7 cents) and Halifax (to a 33-month high), 2.1 cents in Charlottetown (to a 33-month high), and less than a cent in Toronto (to a record 129.7 cents) and Edmonton. The Canadian average retail diesel price, after increasing three straight weeks, declined by 1.9 cents from a record high to 143.2 cents.

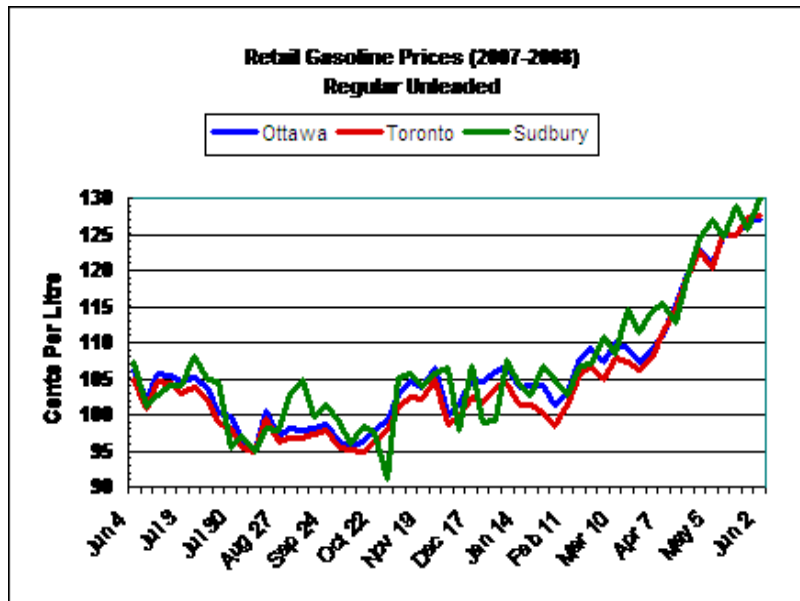
