

Weekly Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending July 28, 2008

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline declined for the third straight week, by 3.8 cents to 124.9 cents a litre, a three-month low, reflecting lower wholesale prices and price wars in some markets.

Prices fell by 9.0 cents in Windsor (to a three-month low), 6.1 cents in North Bay (to a two-month low), 6.0 cents in Sudbury (to a two-month low), 5.0 cents from a record high in Thunder Bay (to a two-month low), 4.6 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a four-week low), 4.0 cents in Toronto West (to a three-month low), 3.6 cents in Ottawa (to a three-month low), 2.9 cents in Toronto East (to a three-month low), 2.7 cents in London (to a three-month low), and 2.0 cents in Timmins (to a two-month low). The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario, after widening three straight weeks, narrowed from a 23-month high of 11.9 cents to 10.8 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined for the second straight week, by 3.9 cents to 138.7 cents, a two-month low.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price declined for the second straight week, by 3.7 cents to 129.2 cents, a two-month low. Prices fell by 9.5 cents from a record high in St. John's (to a two-month low), 9.5 cents in Saint John (to a two-month low), 7.8 cents in Halifax (to a three-month low), 5.5 cents in Montreal (to a two-month low), 5.0 cents in Charlottetown (to a three-month low), 4.1 cents in Calgary (to a two-month low), 4.0 cents in Quebec City (to a three-month low), 3.3 cents in Edmonton (to a two-month low), 2.8 cents in Toronto (to a two-month low), 2.0 cents in Regina (to a two-month low), and 1.8 cents in Vancouver (to a two-month low). Prices rose by 0.1 cents in Winnipeg (from a two-month low). The Canadian average retail diesel price declined for the third straight week, by 4.8 cents to 142.3 cents, a two-month low.

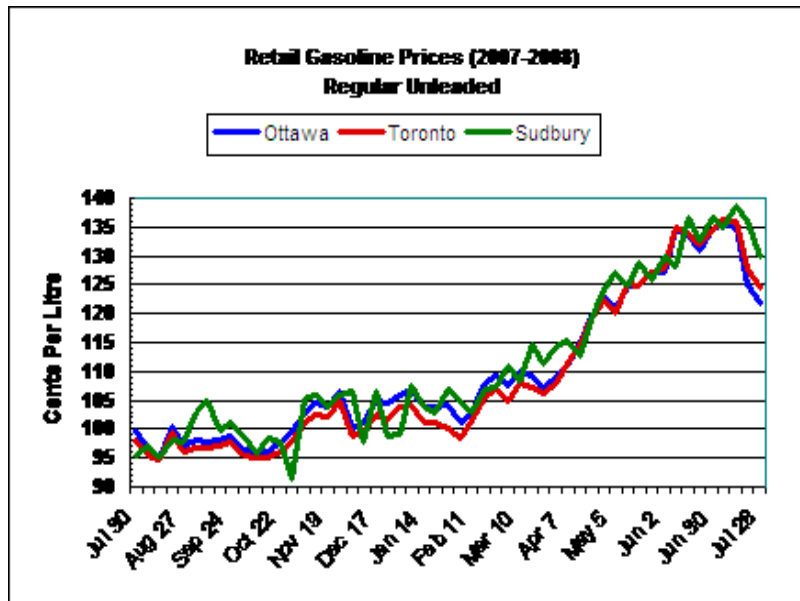
