Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending January 26, 2009

Despite lower wholesale prices, the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline increased for the fourth straight week, albeit by only 0.1 cents, to 80.3 cents a litre, a two-month high.

Prices rose by 5.8 cents in North Bay (to a two-month high), 5.1 cents in Sudbury (to a two-month high), 2.3 cents in Windsor (to a two-month high), and 1.4 cents in Ottawa (to a two-month high). Prices fell by 1.5 cents in Thunder Bay (from a six-week high), 1.0 cents in Timmins, and less than a cent in London (from a two-month high), Toronto (from a two-month high), and Sault Ste. Marie (from a six-week high). The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario widened to 3.6 cents from a five-month low of 2.3 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined for the second straight week, by 1.3 cents to 88.8 cents.

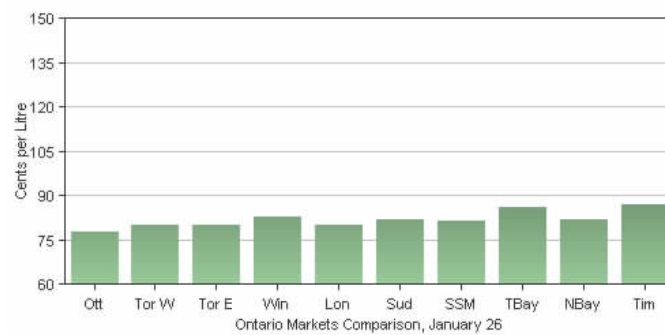
The Canadian average retail gasoline price, after increasing three straight weeks, declined by 2.4 cents from a two-month high to 82.9 cents. Prices fell by 9.7 cents from a three-month high in Montreal (to a four-week low), 1.7 cents in Vancouver (from a two-month high), 1.5 cents in Toronto (from a two-month high), and less than a cent in Regina, Quebec City, Edmonton, Calgary, and Winnipeg, all from a two-month high. Prices rose by 5.8 cents in Saint John, 5.6 cents in St. John's, and 4.7 cents in Halifax, all to a two-month high. The Canadian average retail diesel price declined by 0.8 cents to 91.1 cents.

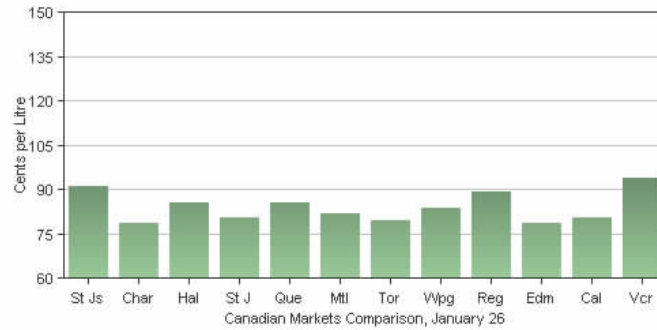

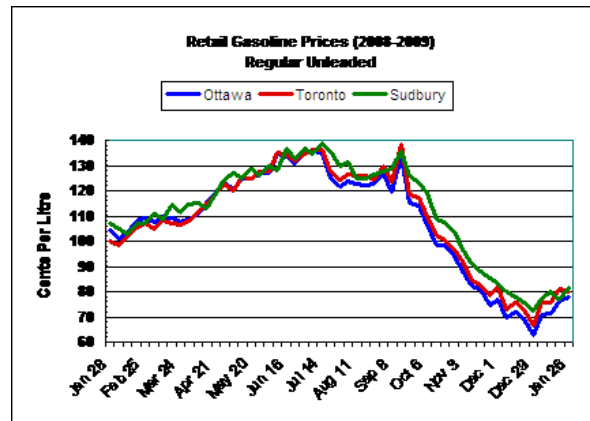
