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Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending June 8, 2009

After rising two straight weeks, the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline declined by 0.5 cents from a seven-month high to 97.7 cents a litre, reflecting lower domestic wholesale prices.

Prices fell by 2.0 cents in both North Bay and Timmins, 1.7 cents in Sudbury, and less than a cent in Toronto (from a seven-month high), London (from a seven-month high), and Ottawa (from a seven-month high). Prices rose by 2.9 cents in Thunder Bay (to a seven-month high), 2.7 cents in Sault Ste. Marie, and 1.8 cents in Windsor (to a seven-month high). Ottawa had the lowest average price for the fourth straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario widened to 3.4 cents from a four-week low of 2.5 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased by 3.9 cents from a four-week low to 84.6 cents, a two-month high.

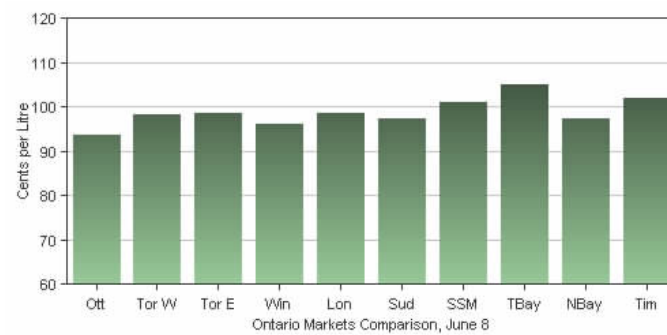
The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased by 1.3 cents to 101.6 cents, an eight-month high. Prices rose by 2.4 cents in both St. John's (to a seven-month high) and Vancouver (to an eight-month high), 2.1 cents in both Saint John (to a seven-month high) and Montreal (to an eight-month high), 1.2 cents in Toronto (to an eight-month high), 1.0 cents in Edmonton (to a seven-month high), and less than a cent in Calgary and Winnipeg (the latter to an eight-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the fourth straight week, by 2.8 cents to 86.4 cents, a two-month high.

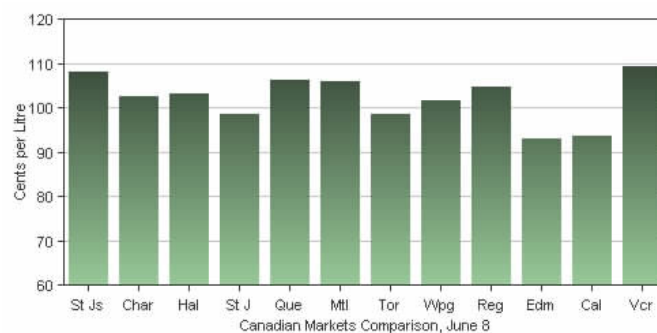

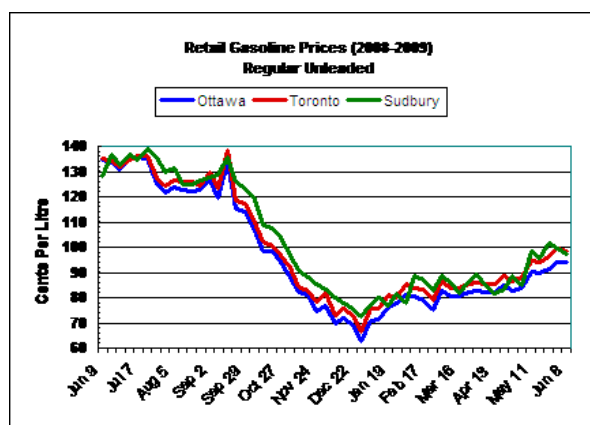
