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Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending June 15, 2009

World crude oil prices above US\$73 a barrel and higher North American wholesale prices caused the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to increase by 2.7 cents to 100.4 cents a litre, an eight-month high.

Prices rose by 7.0 cents in Sudbury, 6.7 cents in North Bay, 3.6 cents in Timmins, 3.0 cents in Ottawa, 2.6 cents in Toronto, 2.3 cents in London, 1.5 cents in Windsor, and 1.4 cents in Thunder Bay (all to an eight-month high). Prices fell by 5.0 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a five-week low), ending Ottawa's four-week reign as the lowest-priced market. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario widened for the second straight week, from 3.4 cents to 3.9 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the second straight week, by 3.2 cents to 87.8 cents, a four-month high.

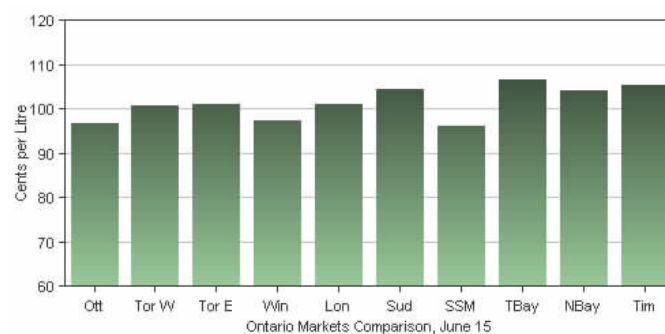
The Canadian average retail gasoline price (revised for some previous weeks) increased for the seventh straight week, by 2.7 cents to 104.3 cents, an eight-month high. Prices rose by 4.2 cents in Toronto, 4.0 cents in Regina, 2.9 cents in Halifax, 2.4 cents in Vancouver, 2.2 cents in Montreal, 1.3 cents in Saint John, 1.0 cents in Charlottetown (all to an eight-month high), and 0.5 cents in Calgary. Prices fell by 3.0 cents in Quebec City (to a four-week low) and 0.2 cents in Winnipeg (from an eight-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the fifth straight week, by 3.5 cents to 89.9 cents, a four-month high.

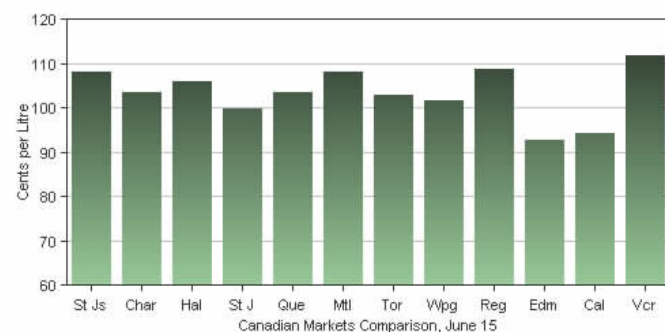

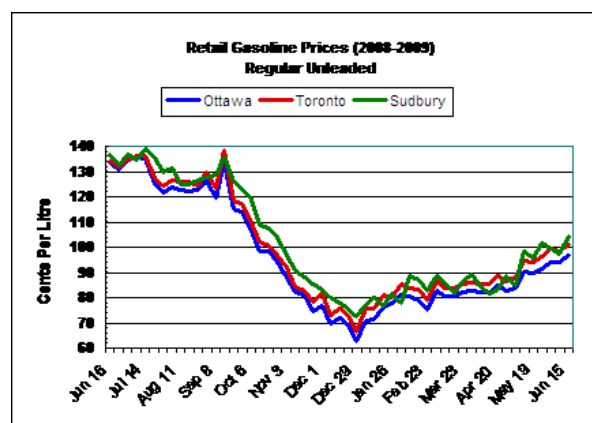
