



Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending July 13, 2009

World crude oil prices below US\$60 a barrel and lower North American wholesale prices caused the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to decline for the fourth straight week, by 4.3 cents to 91.3 cents a litre, a two-month low.

Prices fell by 7.2 cents in Windsor, 5.7 cents in Sault Ste. Marie, 5.5 cents in Sudbury, 5.3 cents in North Bay, 4.3 cents in Toronto, 4.1 cents in London, 4.0 cents in Ottawa, 3.2 cents in Timmins, and 2.3 cents in Thunder Bay. Prices in all these markets were at a two-month low except in Thunder Bay, where they were at a four-week low. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined by 2.5 cents to 87.3 cents, a five-week low.

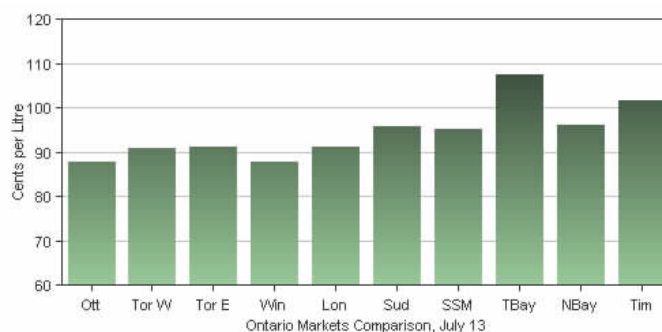
The Canadian average retail gasoline price declined for the fourth straight week, by 2.9 cents to 95.8 cents, a two-month low. Prices fell by 8.0 cents in Quebec City, 6.0 cents in both Halifax and Regina, 4.7 cents in Charlottetown, 3.8 cents in Calgary, 3.5 cents in Toronto, 3.2 cents in Saint John, 3.0 cents in Edmonton, 2.8 cents in Winnipeg, and 2.7 cents in Vancouver. Prices in all these markets were at a two-month high except in Toronto (a three-month high) and Saint John (a six-week high). The Canadian average retail diesel price declined by 2.6 cents from a seven-month high to 90.0 cents.

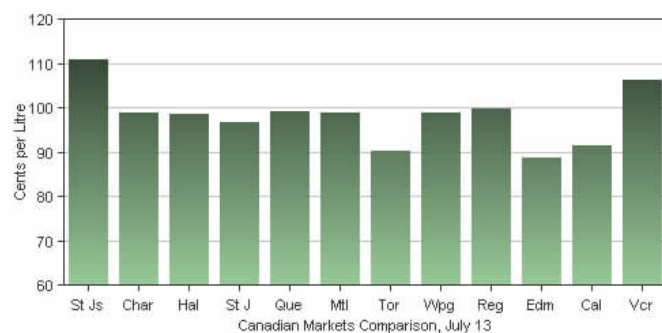

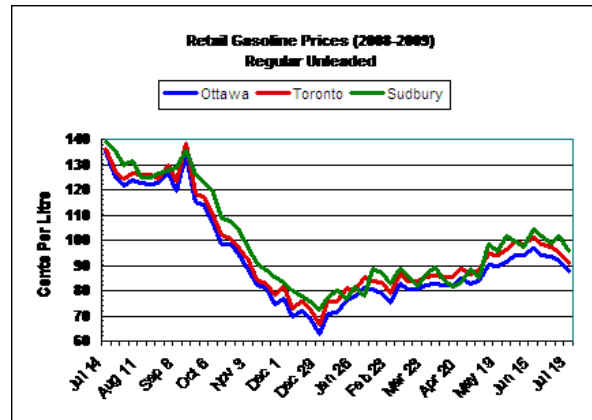
