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Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending July 27, 2009

World crude oil prices above US\$68 a barrel and higher North American wholesale prices caused the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to increase for the second straight week, by 3.1 cents to 94.5 cents a litre.

Prices rose by 11.4 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (from a three-month low), 3.6 cents in Ottawa, 3.4 cents in Toronto (to a four-week high), 3.3 cents in London (to a four-week high), 3.1 cents in Sudbury (from a three-month low), 2.9 cents in North Bay (from a three-month low), and 2.0 cents in Timmins (from a three-month low). Prices fell by 1.3 cents in Windsor (to a three-month low) and 0.7 cents in Thunder Bay (to a two-month low). The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario was unchanged at a five-week low of 4.4 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price, after declining two straight weeks, increased by 0.2 cents from a six-week low to 85.0 cents.

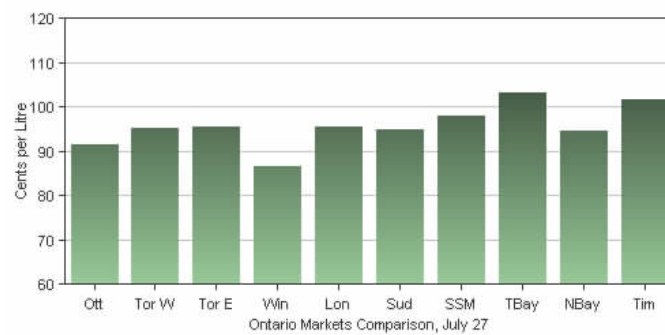
The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the second straight week, by 1.1 cents to 98.0 cents. Prices rose by 3.2 cents in Halifax (from a two-month low), 2.7 cents in Toronto (to a four-week high), 1.7 cents in Saint John (from a two-month low), and 0.3 cents in Calgary (from a two-month low). Prices fell by less than a cent in Quebec City (to a three-month low), Vancouver (to a two-month low), and Montreal (from a four-week high). The Canadian average retail diesel price, after declining two straight weeks, increased by 0.2 cents from a six-week low to 88.0 cents.

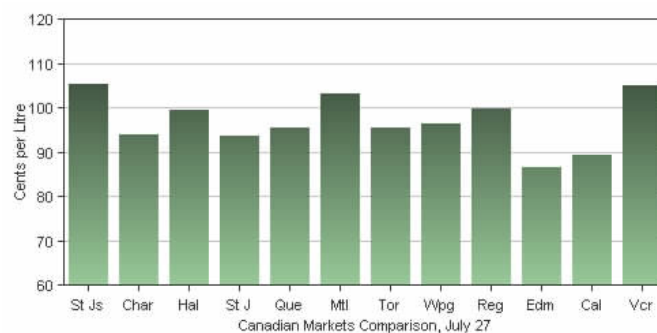

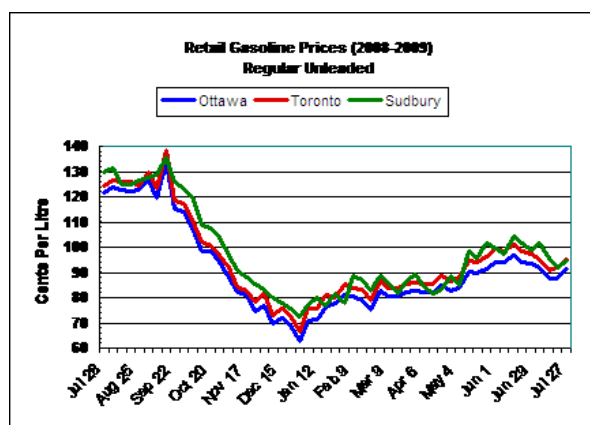
