



Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly.

This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending August 24, 2009

Lower prices in Windsor and several northern cities caused the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to decline for the second straight week, by 0.2 cents to 96.6 cents a litre, a four-week low.

Prices fell by 3.9 cents in Windsor (from a two-month high), 1.9 cents in Sudbury, 1.5 cents in North Bay, and 0.7 cents in Thunder Bay. Prices rose by less than a cent in London, Ottawa, and Toronto. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario, after widening two straight weeks, narrowed from a five-week high of 8.5 cents to 7.6 cents. The Ontario average retail diesel price, after increasing four straight weeks, was unchanged at an eight-month high of 90.9 cents.

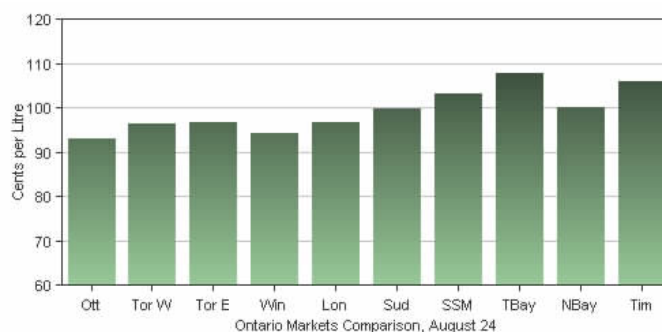
The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased by 0.7 cents to 102.0 cents, a two-month high. Prices rose by 1.7 cents in Vancouver, 1.3 cents in Toronto, and 0.7 cents in Montreal, all to a two-month high. Prices fell by 1.9 cents in Quebec City (to a four-week low) and less than a cent in Saint John, Calgary, and Winnipeg. The Canadian average retail diesel price, after increasing four straight weeks, was unchanged at a six-week high of 92.6 cents.

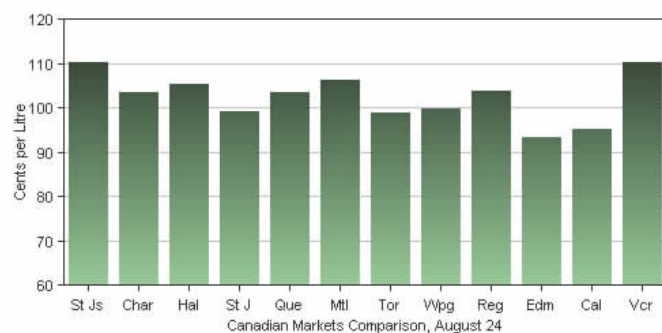

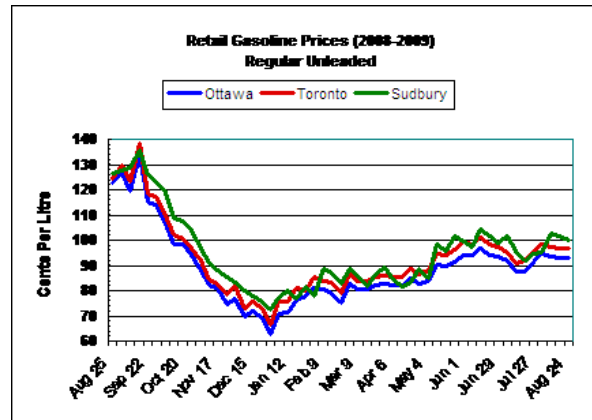
