



GASOLINE REPORT

Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending October 26, 2009.

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline increased for the second straight week, by 2.7 cents to 99.1 cents a litre, a four-month high, reflecting world crude oil prices as high as US\$82 a barrel and higher North American wholesale prices.

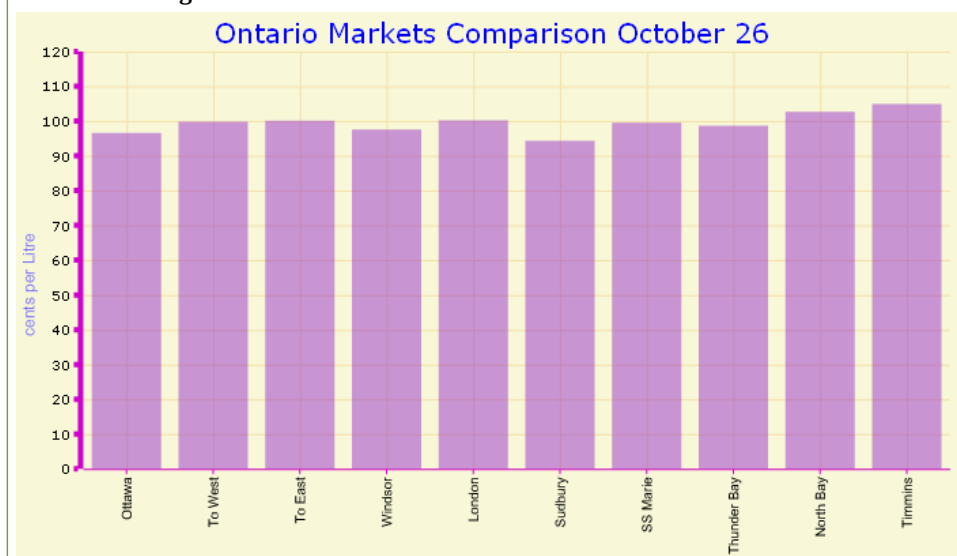
Prices rose by 6.1 cents in North Bay (to a three-month high), 4.1 cents in Windsor (to a two-month high), 3.0 cents in Toronto (to a four-month high), 2.9 cents in Ottawa and London (both to a four-month high), 2.4 cents in Timmins (to a two-month high), and 0.1 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a four-week high). Prices fell by 1.2 cents in Sudbury and 0.7 cents in Thunder Bay (to a five-month low). The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the second straight week, by 2.8 cents to 92.3 cents, its highest since December 2008.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the second straight week, by 3.2 cents to 101.5 cents, a two-month high. Prices rose by 9.0 cents in Regina (to a four-month high), 6.6 cents in Halifax (to a two-month high), 5.1 cents in Charlottetown and Saint John (both to a two-month high), 4.1 cents in Winnipeg (to a six-week high), 3.9 cents in Toronto (to a four-month high), 2.0 cents in Vancouver (to a five-week high), 1.9 cents in Montreal and St. John's (both to a five-week high), 1.6 cents in Quebec City (to a two-month high), and less than a cent in Calgary (to a six-week high) and Edmonton (to a two-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the third straight week, by 3.6 cents to 95.3 cents, its highest since December 2008.

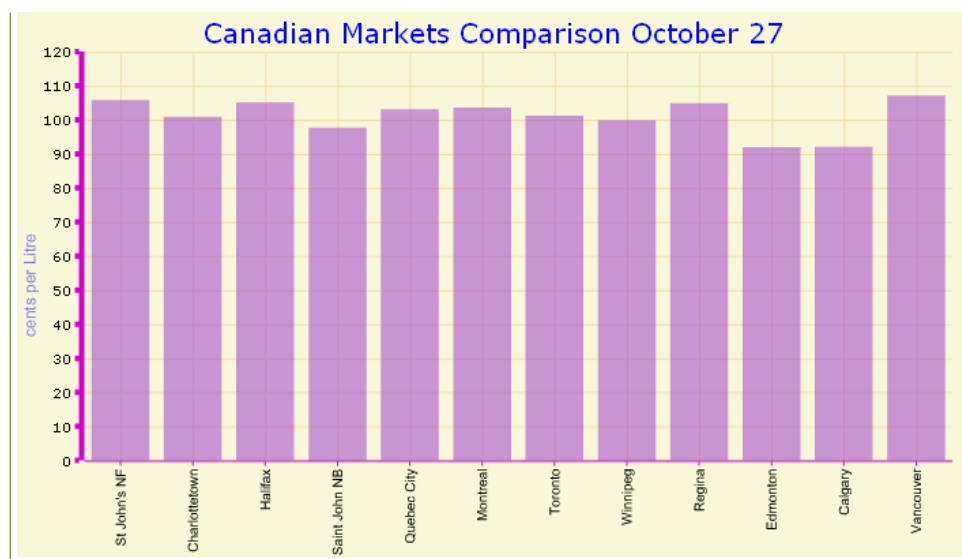

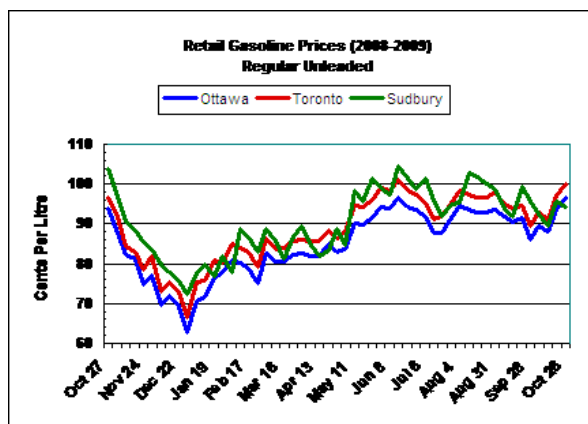
