Gasoline Report

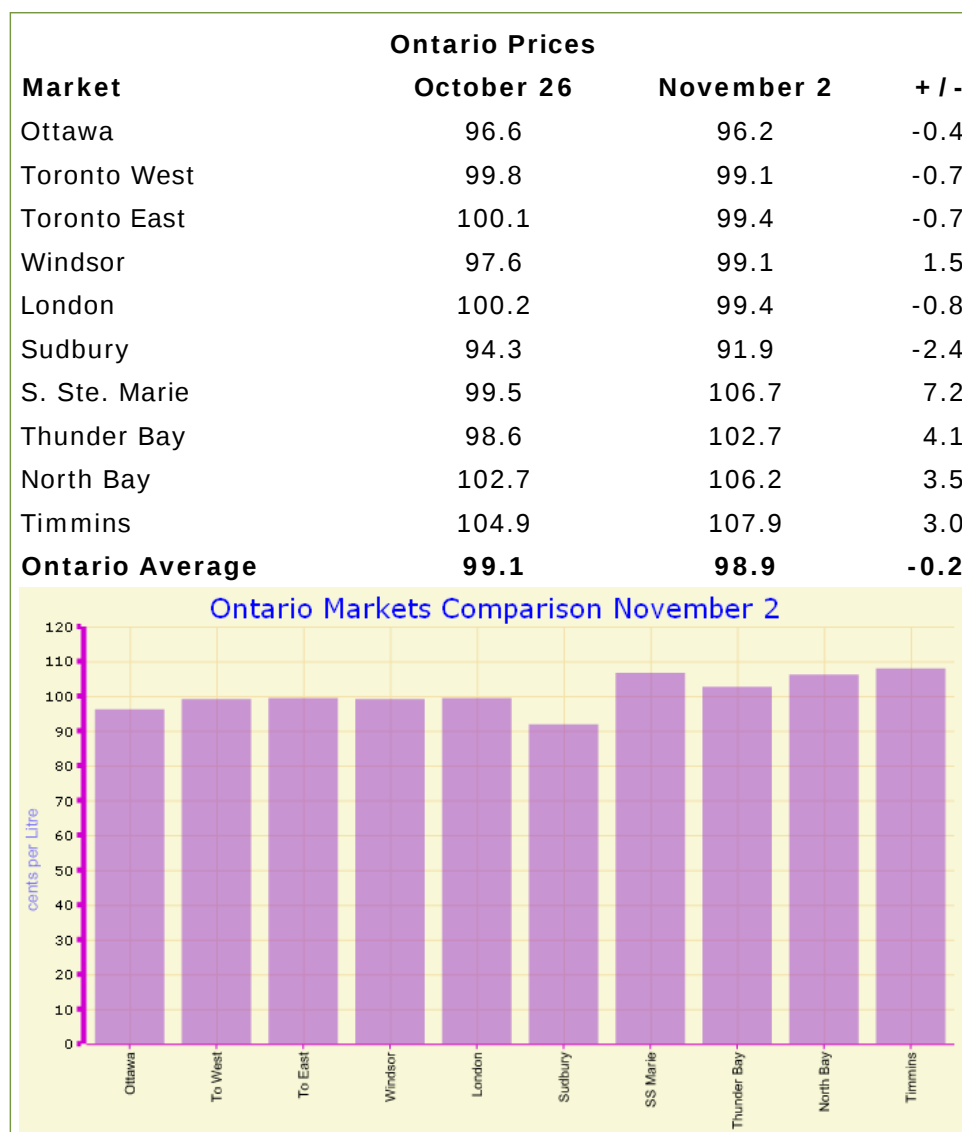
The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending November 2, 2009.

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline, after increasing two straight weeks, declined by 0.2 cents from a four-month high to 98.9 cents a litre as lower prices in the south offset higher prices in the north.

Prices fell by 2.4 cents in Sudbury, and less than a cent in London (from a four-month high), Toronto (from a four-month high), and Ottawa (from a four-month high). Prices rose by 7.2 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a 12-month high), 4.1 cents in Thunder Bay (from a five-month low), 3.5 cents in North Bay (to a 12-month high), 3.0 cents in Timmins (to a 12-month high), and 1.5 cents in Windsor (to a four-month high). The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the third straight week, by 2.5 cents to 94.8 cents, the highest since December 2008.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the third straight week, by 0.6 cents to 102.1 cents, a four-month high. Prices rose by 6.6 cents in St. John's (to a four-month high), 4.0 cents in Saint John (to a four-month high), 3.8 cents in Charlottetown (to a 12-month high), 3.4 cents in Halifax (to a four-month high), 2.3 cents in Calgary (to a two-month high), 1.8 cents in Montreal (to a six-week high), and 0.9 cents in Vancouver (to a six-week high). Prices fell by 1.3 cents in Toronto (from a four-month high), and less than a cent in Quebec City (from a two-month high) and Winnipeg (from a six-week high). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the fourth straight week, by 1.1 cents to 96.4 cents, the highest since December 2008.

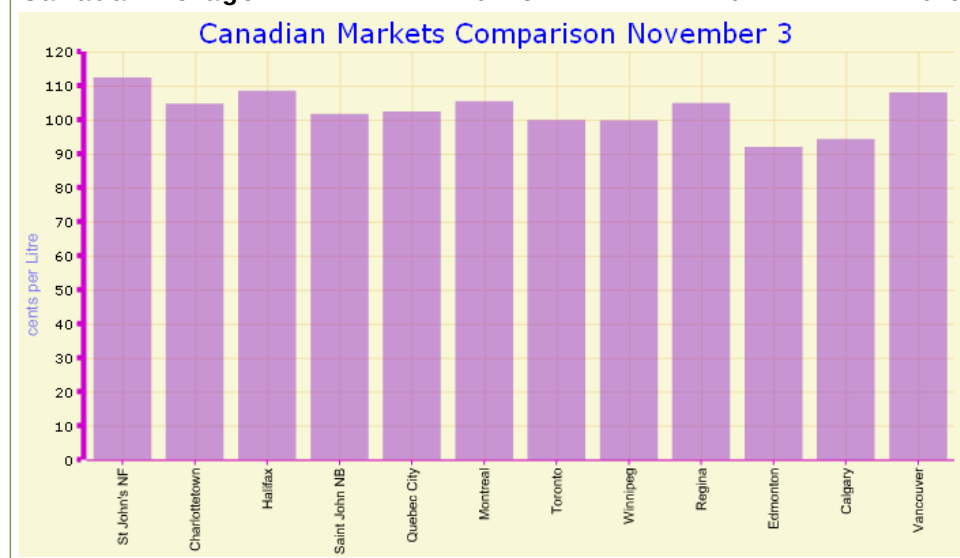

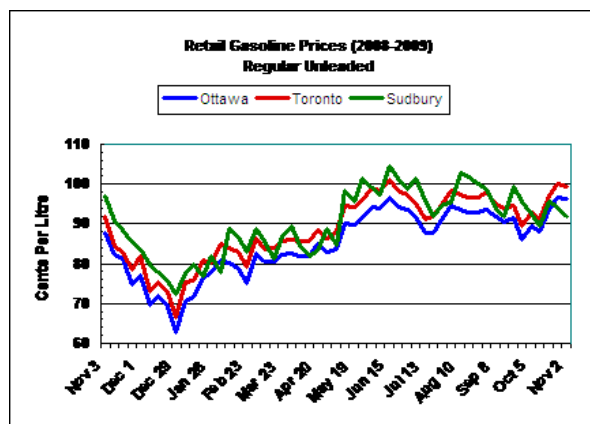
