Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending January 11, 2010.

Higher crude oil and wholesale prices caused the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to increase for the fourth straight week, by 2.3 cents to 99.9 cents a litre, a seven-month high.

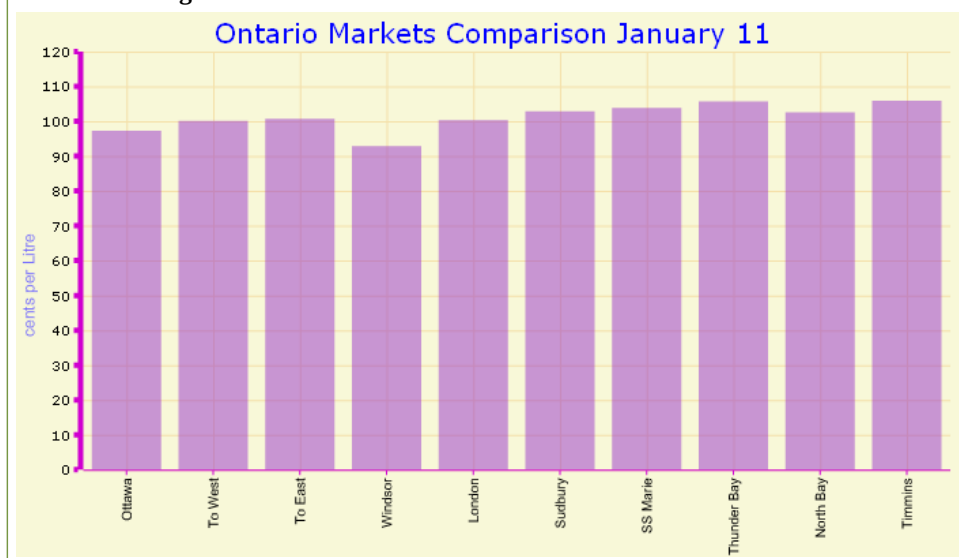
Prices rose by 11.5 cents from an eight-month low in Thunder Bay (to a four-month high), 5.6 cents from a five-month low in Sault Ste. Marie (to a two-month high), 3.6 cents in North Bay (to a two-month high), 3.3 cents in Sudbury (to a five-month high), 2.1 cents in Toronto (to a seven-month high), 1.8 cents in Timmins, and 1.7 cents in both Ottawa (to a 15-month high) and London (to a seven-month high). Prices fell by 1.0 cents in Windsor. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the second straight week, by 2.7 cents to 98.1 cents, a 13-month high.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the fourth straight week, by 1.2 cents to 103.4 cents, a seven-month high. Prices rose by 8.0 cents in Quebec City (to a five-month high), 4.2 cents in Winnipeg (to a two-month high), 2.8 cents in Montreal (to a 15-month high), 2.3 cents in Saint John (to a two-month high), 2.1 cents in Halifax (to a two-month high), 1.9 cents in Vancouver (to a four-month high), 1.7 cents in Charlottetown (to a two-month high), 1.6 cents in Regina (to a two-month high), and 0.5 cents in Toronto (to a three-month high). Prices fell by 2.1 cents in Edmonton (from a four-month high) and 1.4 cents in Calgary (from a two-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the fourth straight week, by 3.5 cents to 100.8 cents, a 13-month high.

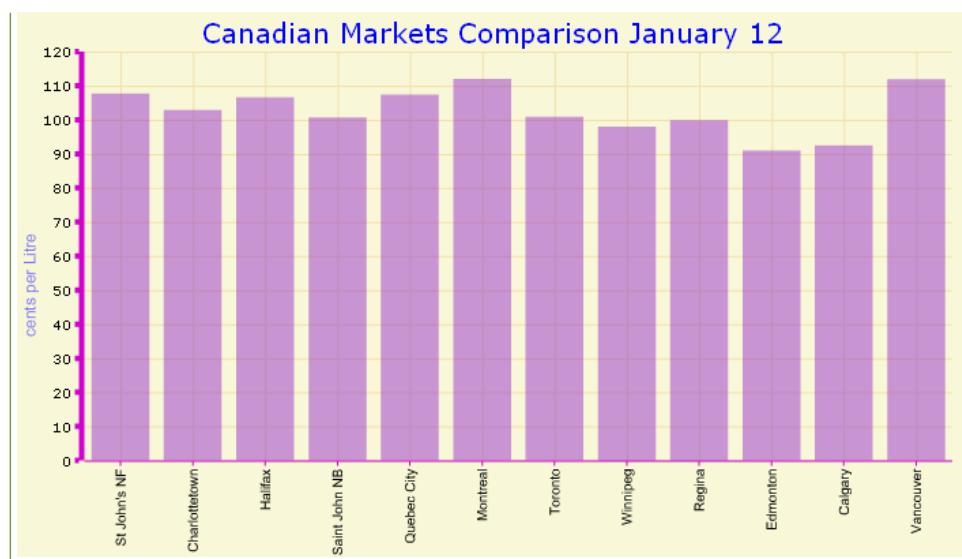

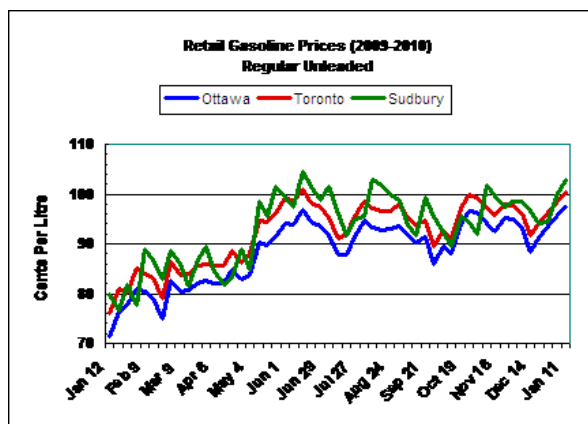
