Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending May 10, 2010.

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline declined by 5.3 cents from an 18-month high to 96.7 cents a litre, a three-month low, reflecting sharply lower world crude oil and North American wholesale prices.

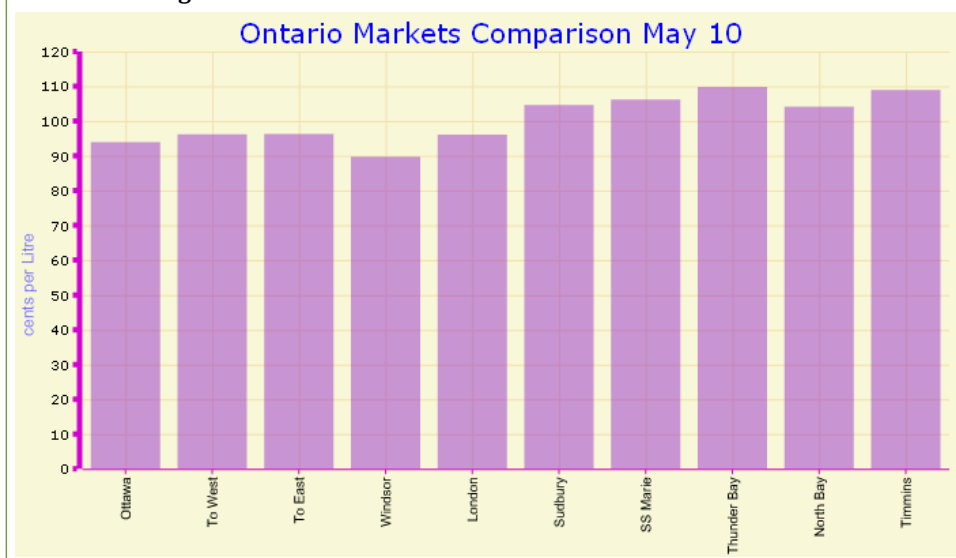
Prices fell by 6.4 cents from a 19-month high in Ottawa (to a three-month low), 6.1 cents from a 19-month high in Toronto (to a three-month low), 5.9 cents in Windsor and London (both to a three-month low), and 0.1 cents in Sudbury (from an 18-month high). Prices rose by 2.8 cents in Thunder Bay (to a 19-month high), 1.0 cents in Sault Ste. Marie, and less than a cent in North Bay (to a six-month high) and Timmins. Windsor had the lowest average price for the 14th straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario widened from 4.1 cents to 11.3 cents, a 17-month high. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the second straight week, by 0.3 cents to 97.1 cents, a four-month high.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price declined by 2.3 cents from an 18-month high to 102.9 cents, a six-week low. Prices fell by 5.4 cents from a 19-month high in Toronto (to a three-month low), 2.7 cents in Edmonton (from an 18-month high), 1.9 cents in Calgary (from an 18-month high), and 0.5 cents in Montreal. Prices rose by 5.0 cents in Quebec City (to a 19-month high), 1.5 cents in Saint John (to a 19-month high), and 1.4 cents in St. John's (to a 19-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price rose for the second straight week, by 0.5 cents to 101.4 cents, a 17-month high.

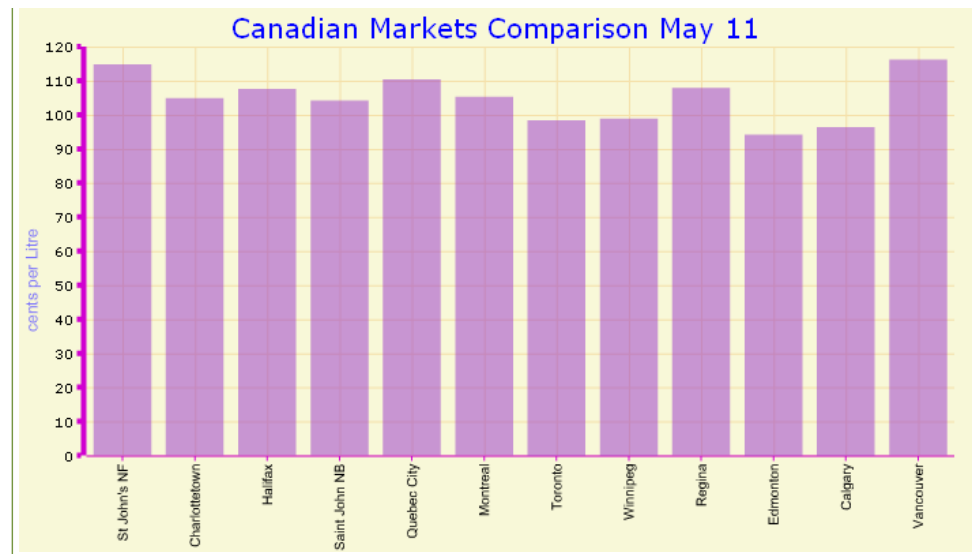

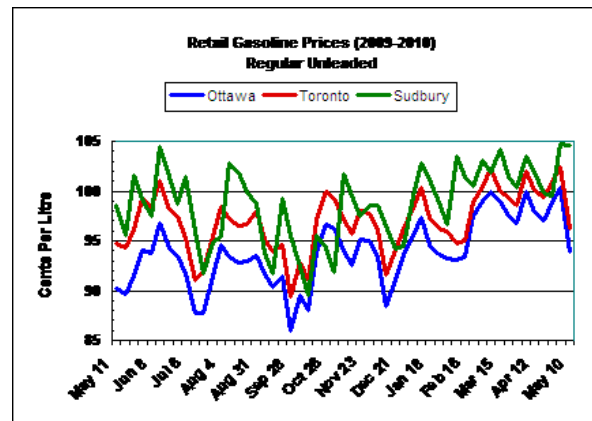
