Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending May 25, 2010.

Pump prices fell in all but one market, driven down by lower wholesale prices and crude oil prices that briefly dropped below US\$64 a barrel, causing the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to decline by 3.1 cents to 95.9 cents a litre, a three-month low.

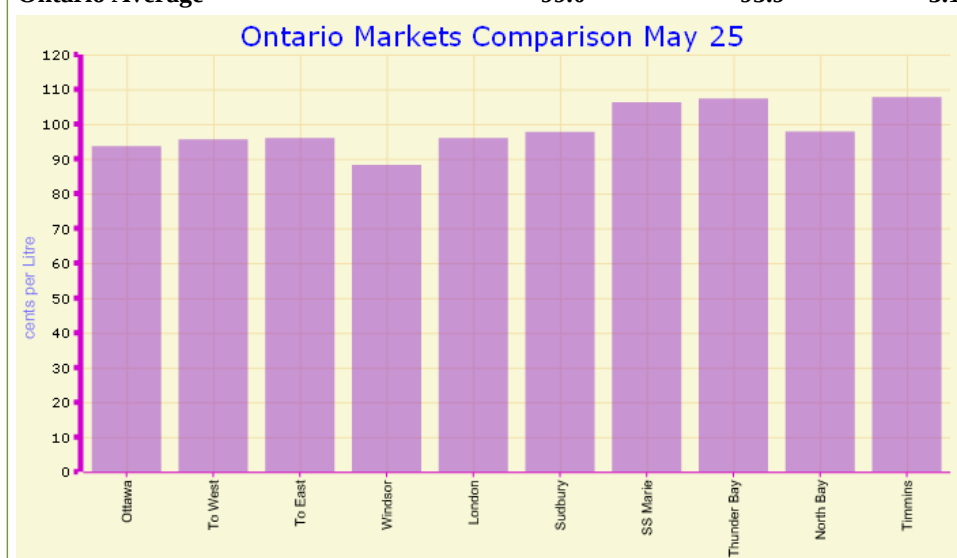
Prices fell by 5.0 cents in Windsor, 3.2 cents in both Toronto and Sudbury, 3.1 cents in Ottawa, 3.0 cents in London, 2.8 cents in North Bay, 2.5 cents in Thunder Bay (from a 19-month high), and 1.2 cents in Timmins. Prices in all these markets were at a three-month low except in Sudbury and North Bay (which were at a four-month low) and Thunder Bay. Windsor had the lowest average price for the sixteenth straight week; the Windsor Star attributed this to a price war initiated by a new Costco gas bar. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined for the second straight week, by 1.7 cents to 95.2 cents, a three-month low.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price declined for the third straight week, by 1.4 cents to 99.9 cents, a three-month low. Prices fell by 5.0 cents in both Charlottetown (to a five-month low) and Regina (to a two-month low), 3.8 cents in Quebec City (to a three-month low), 3.4 cents in Halifax (to a five-month low), 2.9 cents in Calgary (to a two-month low), 2.1 cents in Edmonton (to a two-month low), 1.3 cents in Toronto (to a three-month low), 1.1 cents in Winnipeg (to a three-month low), and less than a cent in St. John's (to a three-month low), Saint John (to a three-month low), and Vancouver (to a two-month low). The Canadian average retail diesel price declined for the second straight week, by 1.4 to 98.3 cents, a two-month low.

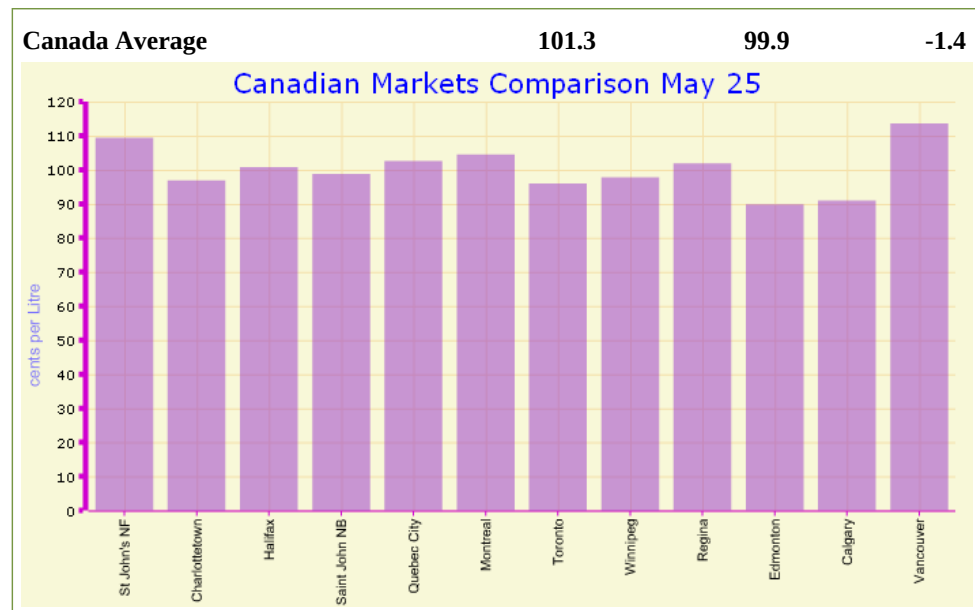

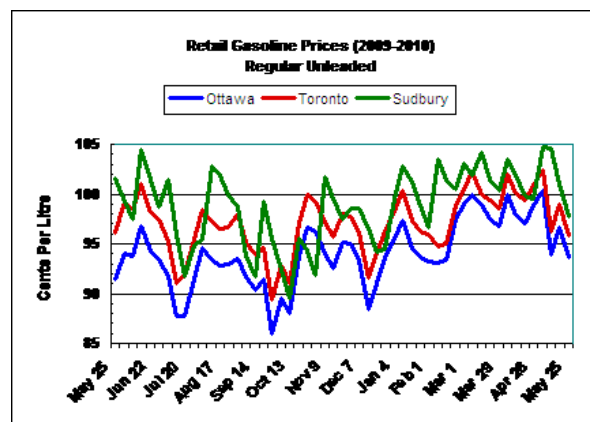
