Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending May 31, 2010.

The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline increased by 0.7 cents from a three-month low to 96.6 cents a litre, reflecting the end of price wars in some markets and higher wholesale prices.

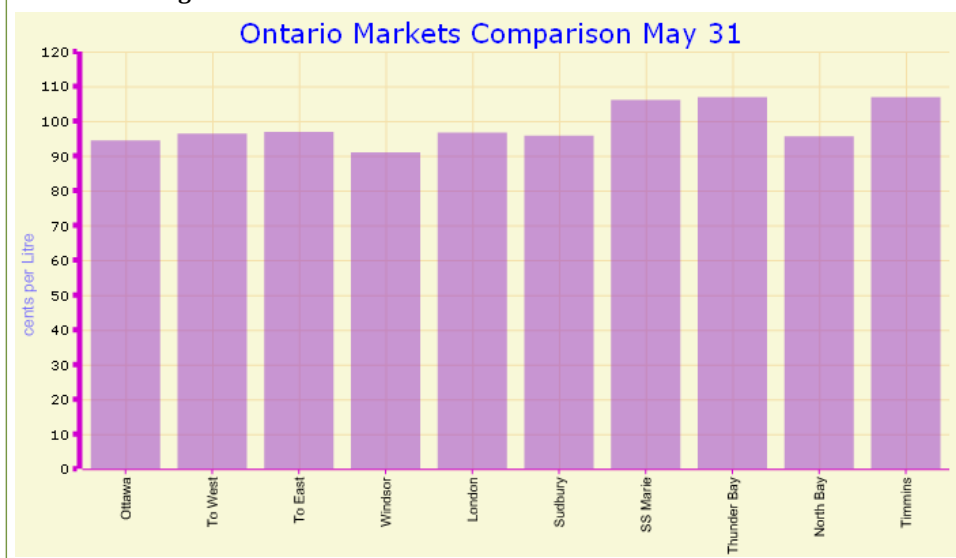
Prices rose by 2.7 cents in Windsor and less than a cent in Toronto, Ottawa, and London, all from a three-month low. Prices fell by 2.3 cents in North Bay (to a five-month low), 2.0 cents in Sudbury (to a five-month low), and less than a cent in Timmins (to a three-month low), Thunder Bay, and Sault Ste. Marie. Windsor had the lowest average price for the 17th straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario narrowed from 8.0 cents to 5.9 cents, a four-week low. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined for the third straight week, by 1.0 cents to 94.2 cents, a three-month low.

The Canadian average retail gasoline price declined for the fourth straight week, by 0.9 cents to 99.0 cents, a four-month low. Prices fell by 3.6 cents in Saint John (to a five-month low), 3.5 cents in St. John's (to a seven-month low), 2.7 cents in Halifax (to a five-month low), 2.2 cents in Calgary (to a four-month low), 2.0 cents in Edmonton (to a four-month low), 1.8 cents in Vancouver (to a two-month low), 1.2 cents in Quebec City (to a five-month low), 1.0 cents in Montreal (to a two-month low), and 0.8 cents in Winnipeg (to a three-month low). Prices rose by 1.8 cents in Charlottetown (from a five-month low) and 0.3 cents in Toronto (from a three-month low). The Canadian average retail diesel price declined for the third straight week, by 1.7 to 96.6 cents, a three-month low.

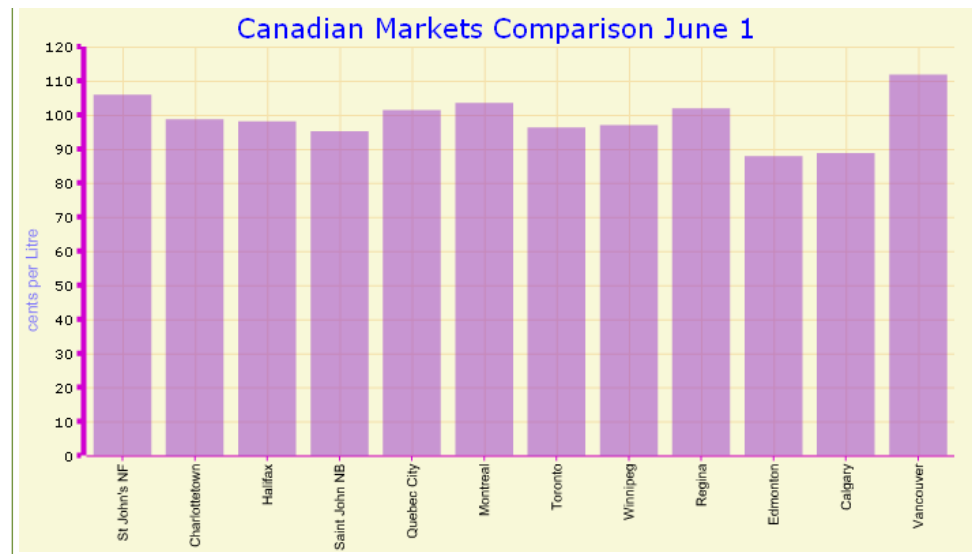

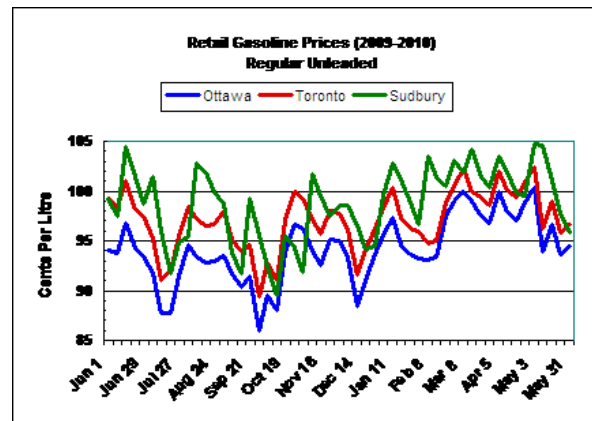
