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GASOLINE REPORT

Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending June 28, 2010.

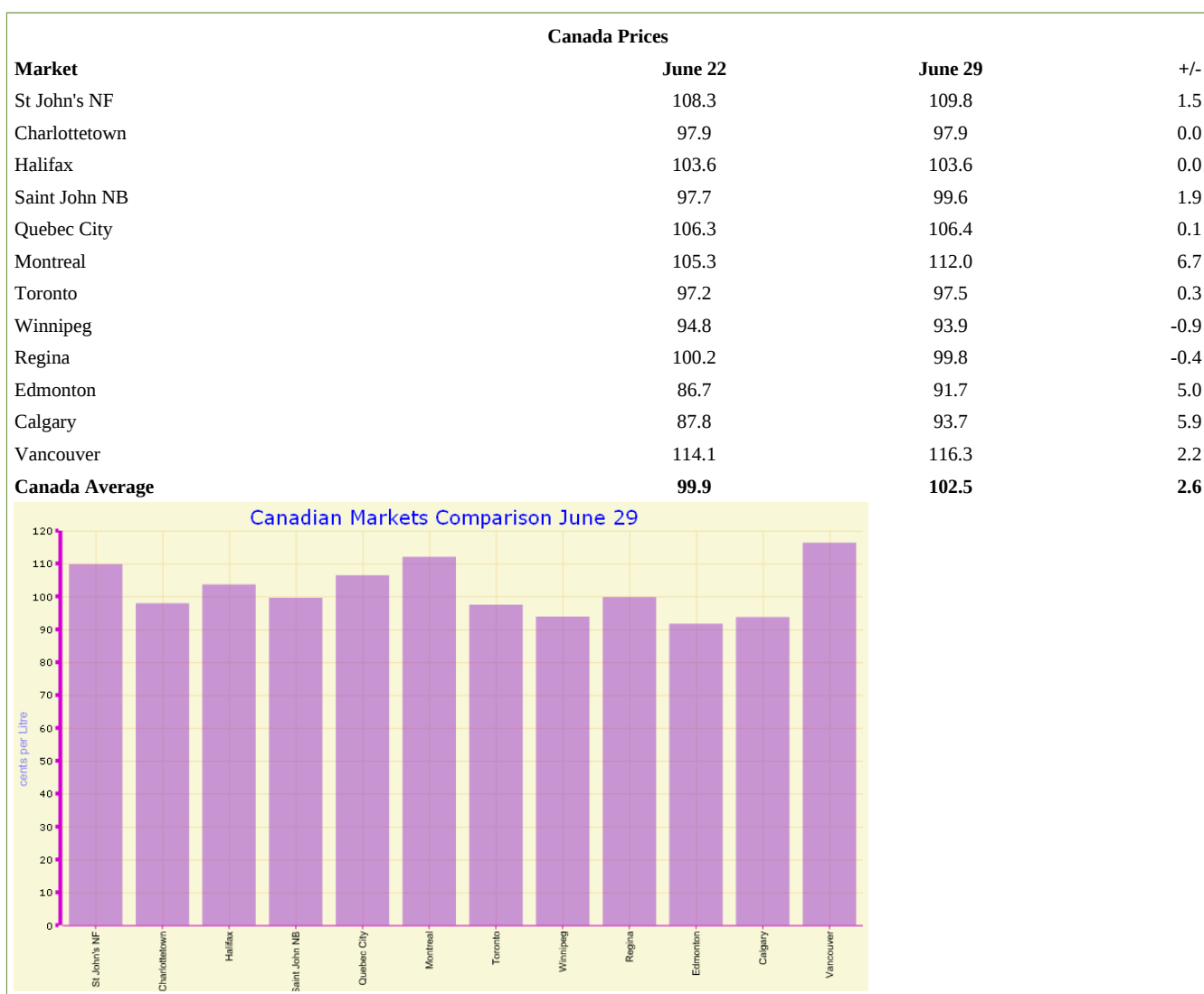
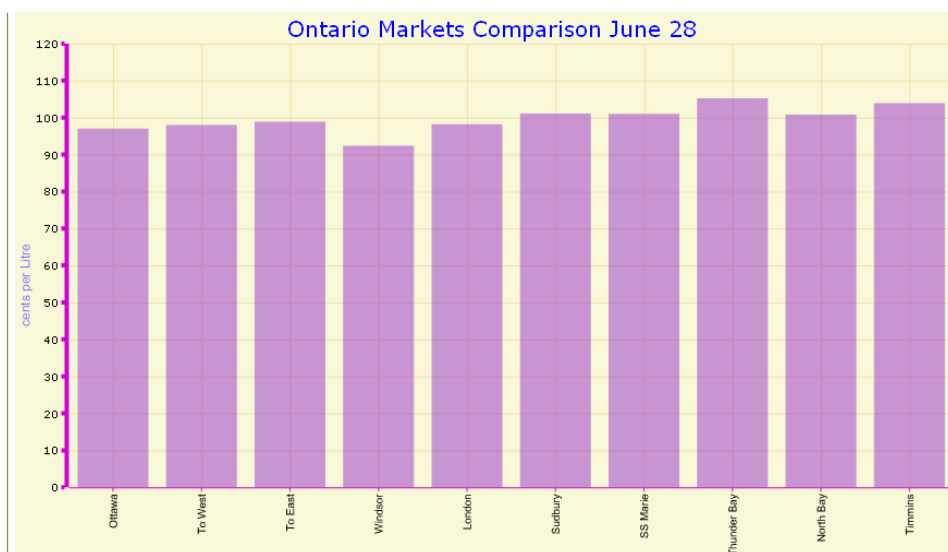
Despite lower wholesale prices, the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline increased for the third straight week, by 1.6 cents to 98.3 cents a litre.

Prices rose by 2.6 cents in Sudbury (to a two-month high), 1.9 cents in both Toronto and North Bay (the latter to a two-month high), 1.7 cents in London, 1.5 cents in Ottawa (to a two-month high), and 1.0 cents in Windsor. Prices fell by 1.2 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a four-month low) and 0.1 cents in Thunder Bay. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased by 0.3 cents to 94.1 cents. In the second quarter of 2010, the Ontario regular gasoline price averaged 98.1 cents, up by 5.4 cents from the same period in 2009, and the Ontario diesel price averaged 95.5 cents, up 11.7 cents.

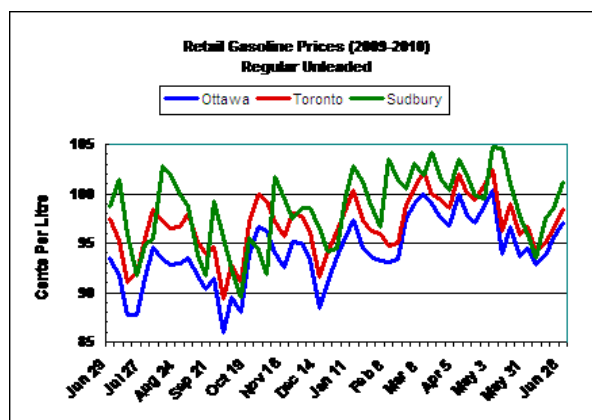
The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the second straight week, by 2.6 cents to 102.5 cents, a two-month high. Prices rose by 6.7 cents in Montreal (to a two-month high), 5.9 cents in Calgary (from a six-month low), 5.0 cents in Edmonton (from a six-month low), 2.2 cents in Vancouver (to a 21-month high), 1.9 cents in Saint John, 1.5 cents in St. John's, and less than a cent in Toronto (to a two-month high) and Quebec City. Prices fell by less than a cent in Winnipeg (to a six-month low) and Regina (to a five-month low). The Canadian average retail diesel price rose for the third straight week, by 0.6 cents to 97.1 cents. In the second quarter, the Canadian regular gasoline price averaged 102.0 cents, up 5.9 cents from a year earlier, and the Canadian diesel price averaged 98.5 cents, up 12.7 cents.
