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GASOLINE REPORT

Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending July 12, 2010.

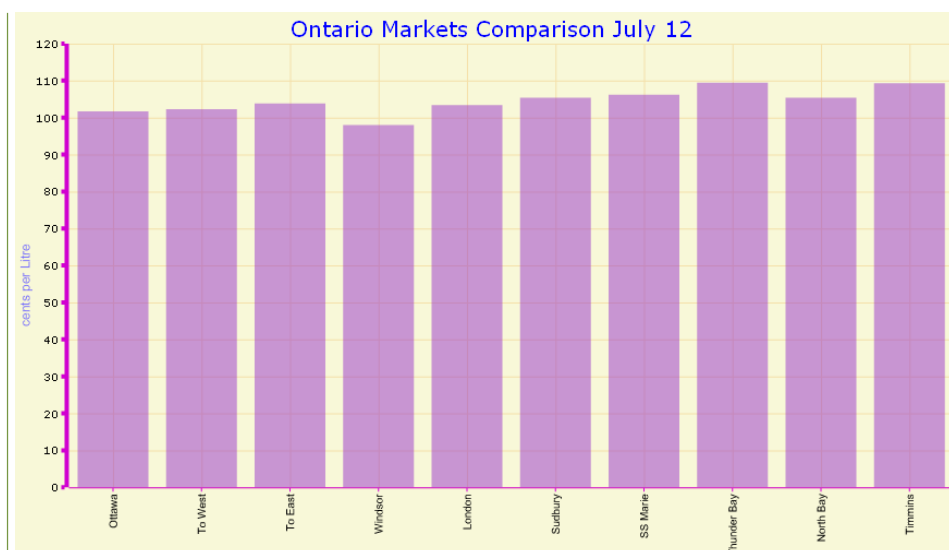
The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline increased for the fifth straight week, by 1.6 cents to 103.0 cents a litre, a 21-month high.

Prices rose by 2.3 cents in Ottawa, and 2.1 cents in both Toronto and London, all to a 21-month high. Prices fell by 1.5 cents in Windsor (from a 12-month high), 1.3 cents in North Bay (from a 21-month high), 1.2 cents in Sudbury (from a 21-month high), and less than a cent in Sault Ste. Marie (from an eight-month high) and Thunder Bay (from a two-month high). Windsor had the lowest average price for the fifth straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario narrowed from 7.3 cents to 4.6 cents, a two-month low. The Ontario average retail diesel price, after increasing two straight weeks, declined by 0.6 cents from a 19-month high to 99.2 cents.

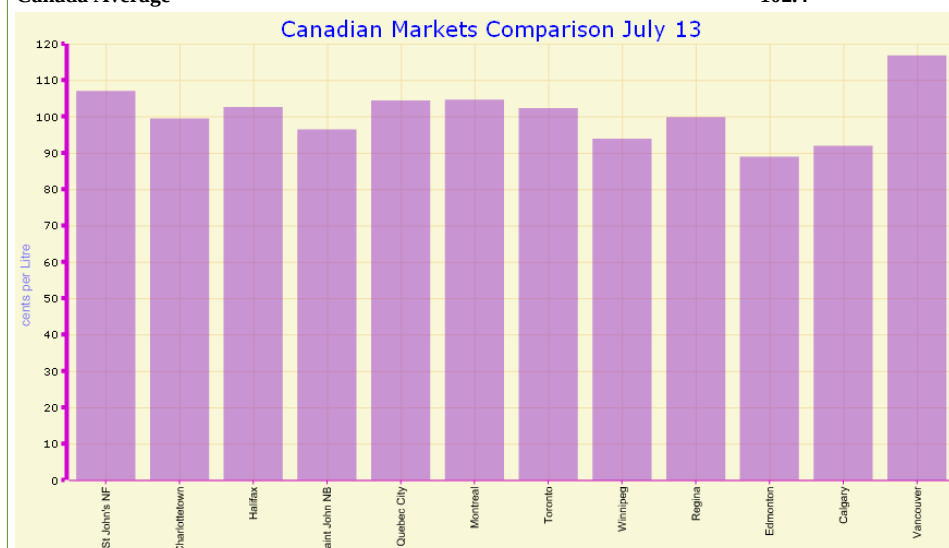
The Canadian average retail gasoline price was unchanged at 102.4 cents. Prices rose by 2.1 cents in Montreal (from a six-month low), and less than a cent in Vancouver (to a 21-month high) and Toronto (to a two-month high). Prices fell by 3.0 cents in both St. John's (from a two-month high) and Saint John, 2.7 cents in Halifax (from a two-month high), 2.0 cents in Edmonton, 1.7 cents in Calgary, 1.0 cents in Quebec City, and less than a cent in Charlottetown (from a two-month high) and Regina. The Canadian average retail diesel price, after increasing four straight weeks, declined by 0.6 cents from a six-week high to 97.6 cents.

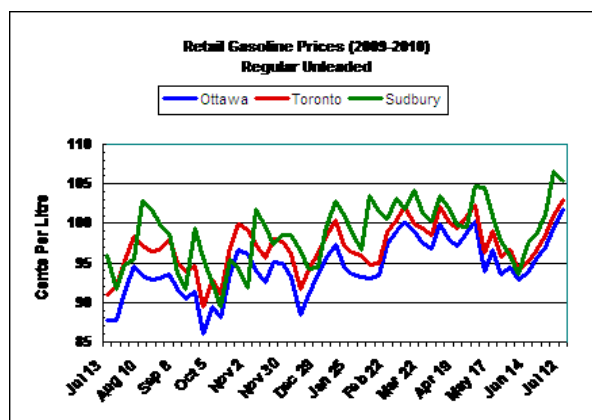
