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GASOLINE REPORT

Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending August 30, 2010.

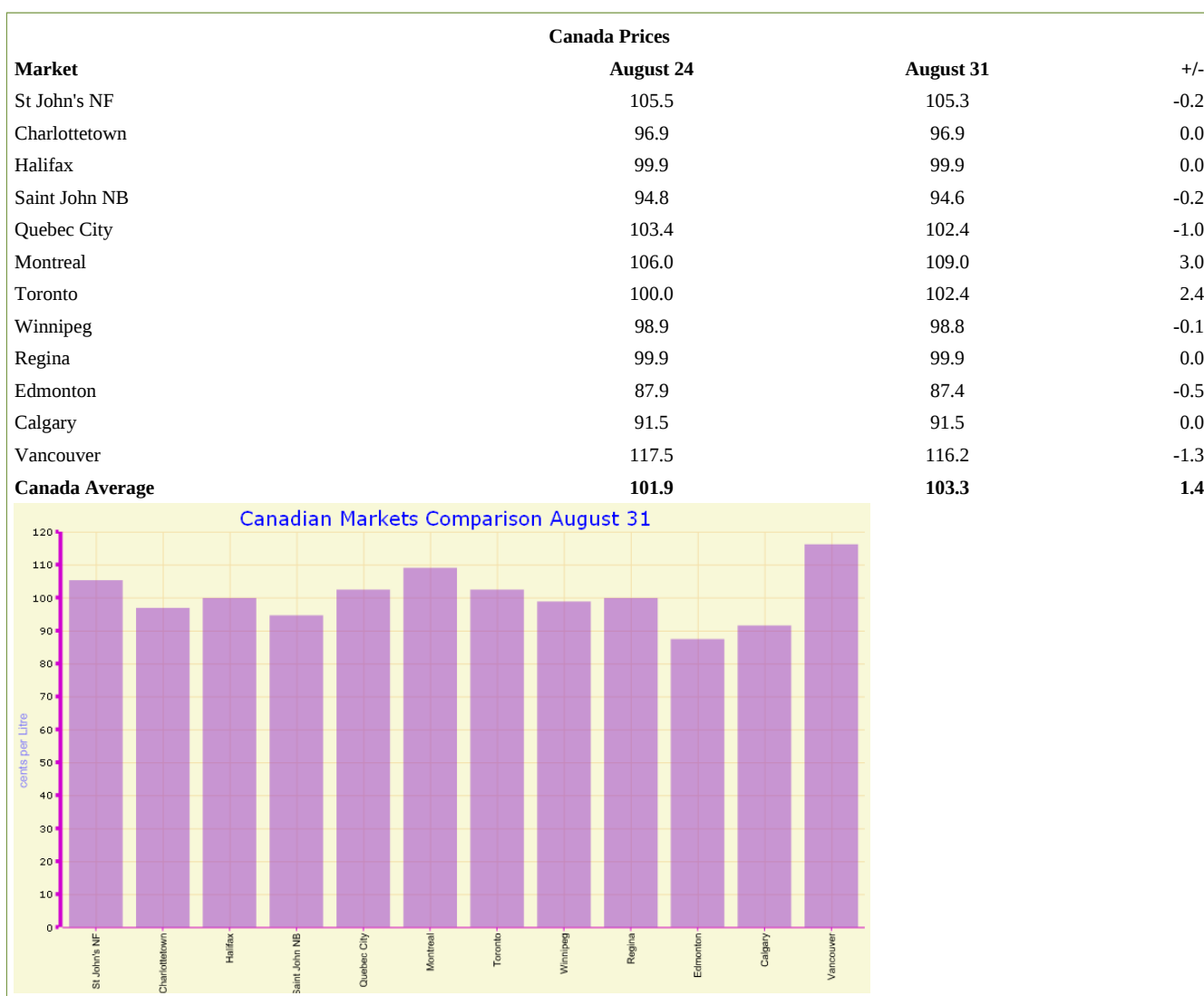
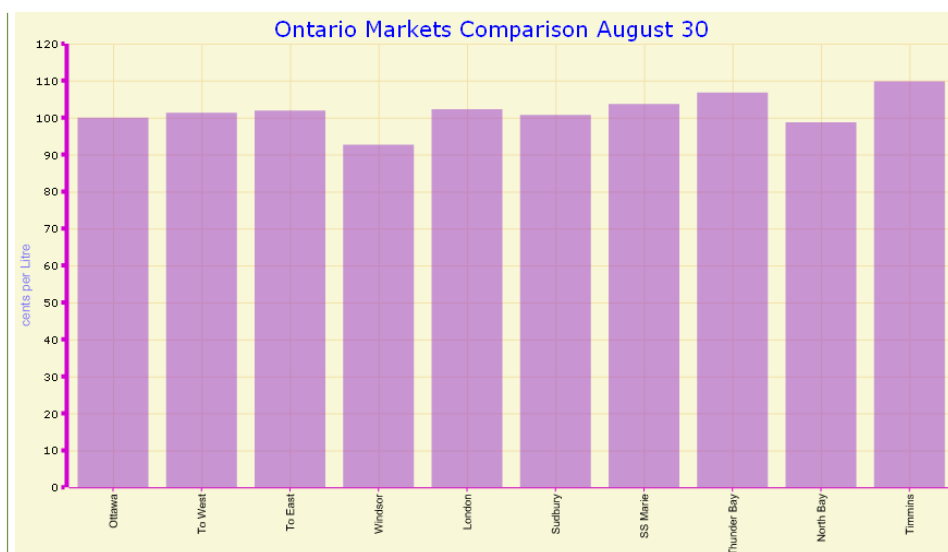
The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline increased for the second straight week, by 1.1 cents to 101.1 cents a litre, reflecting higher wholesale prices.

Prices rose by 2.2 cents in London, 2.1 cents in Ottawa, and 1.4 cents in Toronto. Prices fell by 3.9 cents in North Bay (to a three-month low), 2.0 cents in Sudbury (to a two-month low), 1.5 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a two-month low), 1.2 cents in Thunder Bay (to a two-month low), and less than a cent in Windsor (to a two-month low) and Timmins. Windsor had the lowest average price for the eighth straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario narrowed for the second straight week, from 6.0 cents to 2.8 cents, a five-month low. The Ontario average retail diesel price, after declining two straight weeks, increased by 0.5 cents from a two-month low to 99.3 cents.

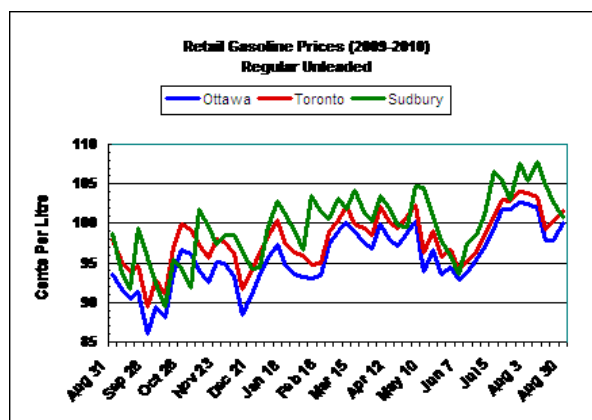
The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the second straight week, by 1.4 cents to 103.3 cents. Prices rose by 3.0 cents in Toronto and 2.4 cents in Montreal. Prices fell by 1.3 cents in Vancouver (to a two-month low), 1.0 cents in Quebec City (to a three-month low), and less than a cent in Edmonton (to a two-month low), St. John's (to a ten-month low), Saint John (to an eight-month low), and Winnipeg (from a three-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased by 0.9 cents to 99.5 cents.
