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GASOLINE REPORT

Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending September 27, 2010.

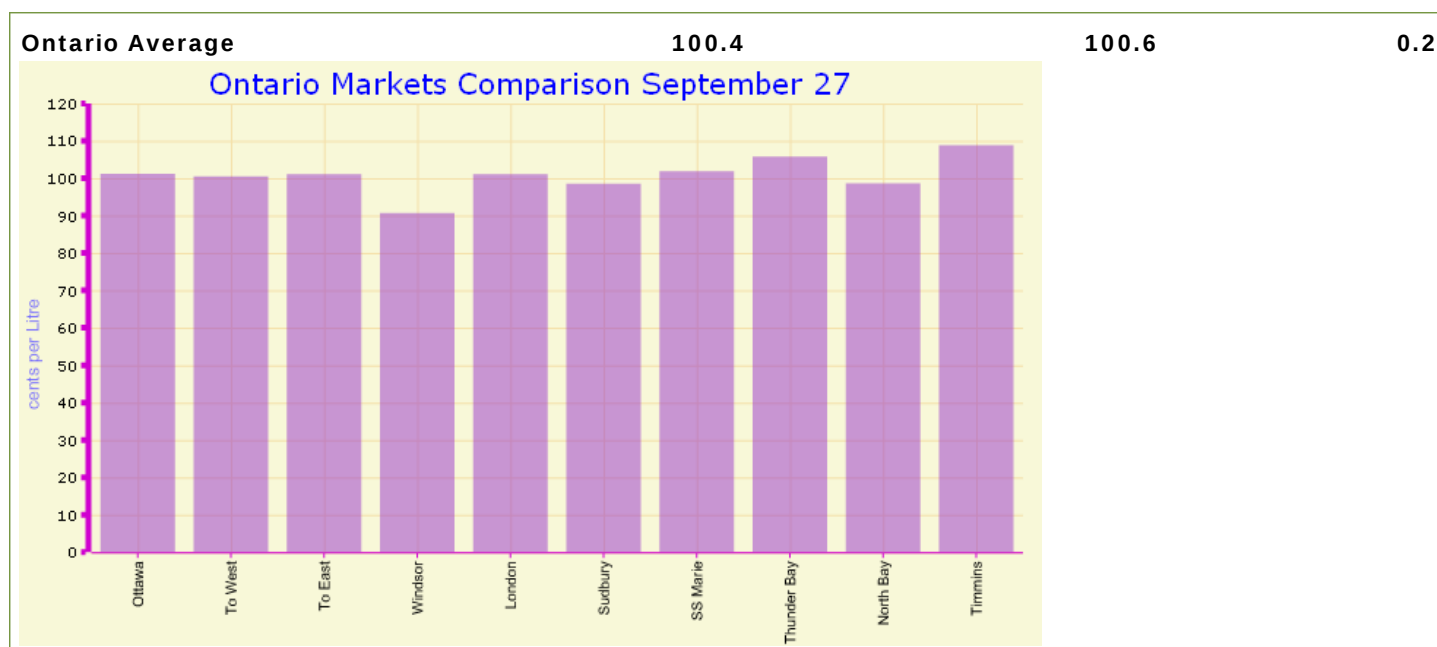
The Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline increased by 0.2 cents from a four-week low to 100.6 cents a litre, reflecting higher wholesale prices.

Prices rose by 1.0 cents in Ottawa and 0.5 cents in both Toronto and London. Prices fell by 3.3 cents in Windsor (to a three-month low), 2.4 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (to a three-month low), 2.3 cents in Sudbury (to a three-month low), 2.1 cents in North Bay (to a three-month low), and 0.1 cents in Thunder Bay. Windsor had the lowest average price for the twelfth straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario narrowed from 3.7 cents to 1.8 cents, a six-month low. The Ontario average retail diesel price was unchanged at a six-week high of 99.7 cents. In the third quarter of 2010, the Ontario regular gasoline price averaged 101.7 cents, up 6.9 cents from the same period in 2009, and the Ontario diesel price averaged 99.4 cents, up 10.7 cents.

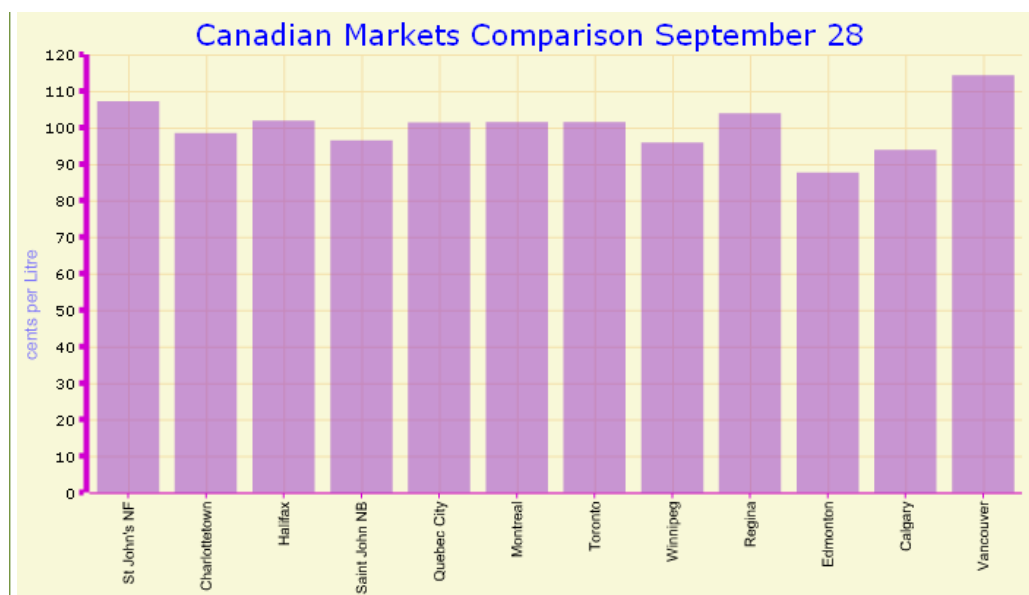
The Canadian average retail gasoline price declined for the second straight week, by 0.6 cents to 101.8 cents. Prices fell by 2.9 cents in Winnipeg (to a two-month low), 2.4 cents in Halifax, 2.3 cents in Edmonton, 2.0 cents in Quebec City, 1.6 cents in Calgary, 1.3 cents in Saint John, 1.1 cents in St. John's, and less than a cent in Montreal (to a two-month low) and Toronto. Prices rose by 0.3 cents in Vancouver. The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the fifth straight week, by 0.5 cents to 100.8 cents, a five-month high. In the third quarter of 2010, the Canadian gasoline price averaged 102.7 cents, up 3.6 cents from the same period in 2009, and the Canadian diesel price averaged 98.9 cents, up 8.0 cents.

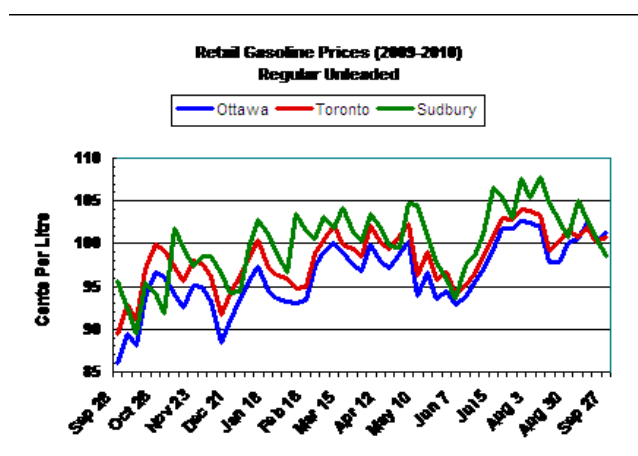
