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GASOLINE REPORT

Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending October 18, 2010.

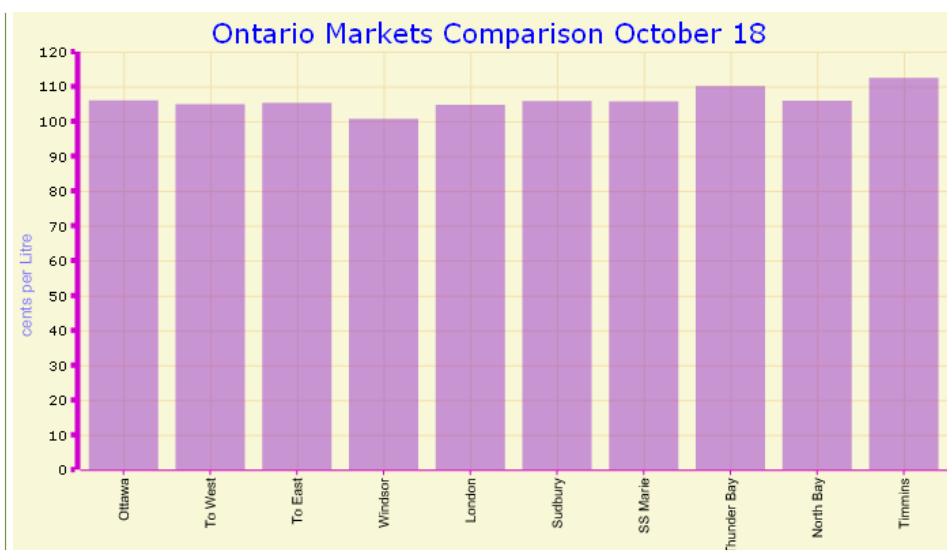
After increasing three straight weeks, the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline declined by 0.8 cents from a 24-month high to 105.3 cents a litre, reflecting lower world crude oil and North American wholesale prices.

Prices fell by 2.7 cents in Sudbury (from a 24-month high), 2.1 cents in North Bay (from a 24-month high), 1.6 cents in both London (from a 24-month high) and Sault Ste. Marie (from a three-month high), 1.5 cents in Toronto (from a 24-month high), and less than a cent in Ottawa (from a 24-month high) and Timmins (from a two-month high). Prices rose by 5.6 cents in Windsor and 4.9 cents in Thunder Bay (both to a 24-month high). Despite its increase, Windsor had the lowest average price for the fifteenth straight week. The Ontario average retail diesel price increased for the third straight week, by 0.6 cents to 104.1 cents, its highest level since November 2008.

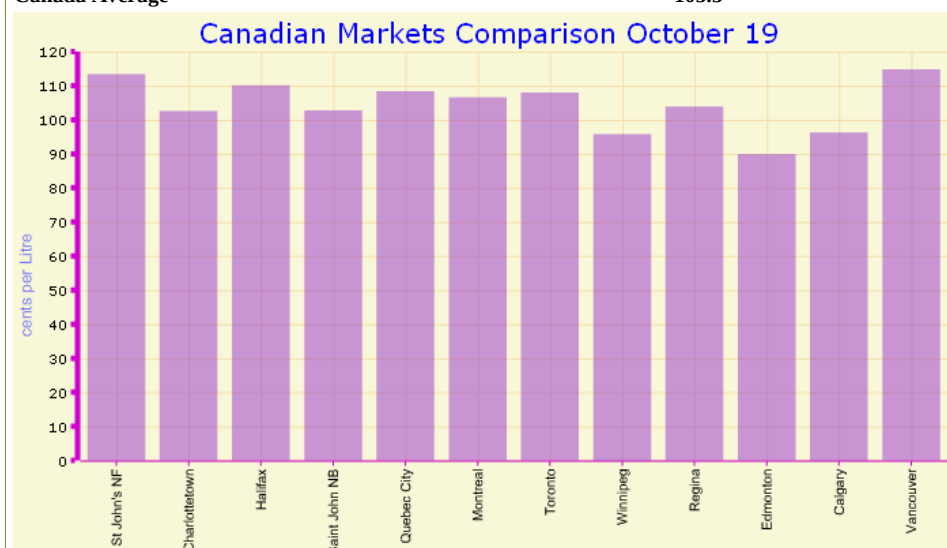
The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased by 0.7 cents to 106.2 cents, its highest level since October 2008. Prices rose by 4.1 cents in Charlottetown (to a five-month high), 1.9 cents in Saint John (to a five-month high), 1.8 cents in St. John's (to a five-month high), 1.4 cents in Montreal, and 0.9 cents in Toronto (to a 25-month high). Prices fell by 3.6 cents in Edmonton (from a five-month high) and less than a cent in Vancouver and Winnipeg (the latter to a three-month low). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased for the eighth straight week, by 1.0 cents to 105.3 cents, its highest level since November 2008.

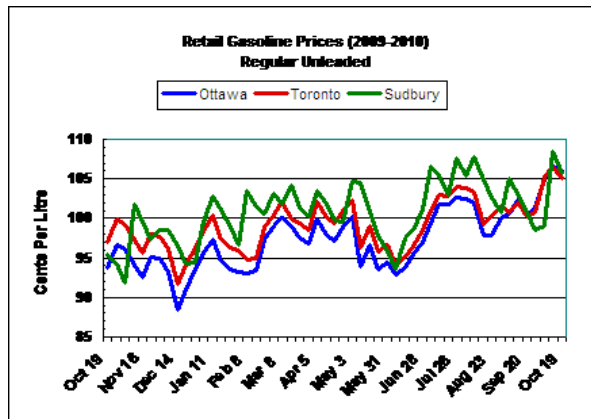
