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GASOLINE REPORT

Gasoline Report

The Gasoline Report is a roundup of consumer gasoline prices from across Ontario and Canada. The graph shows price trends for three Ontario cities for the previous 12 month period. The report and graph are updated weekly. This week's Gasoline Report is for the week ending December 6, 2010.

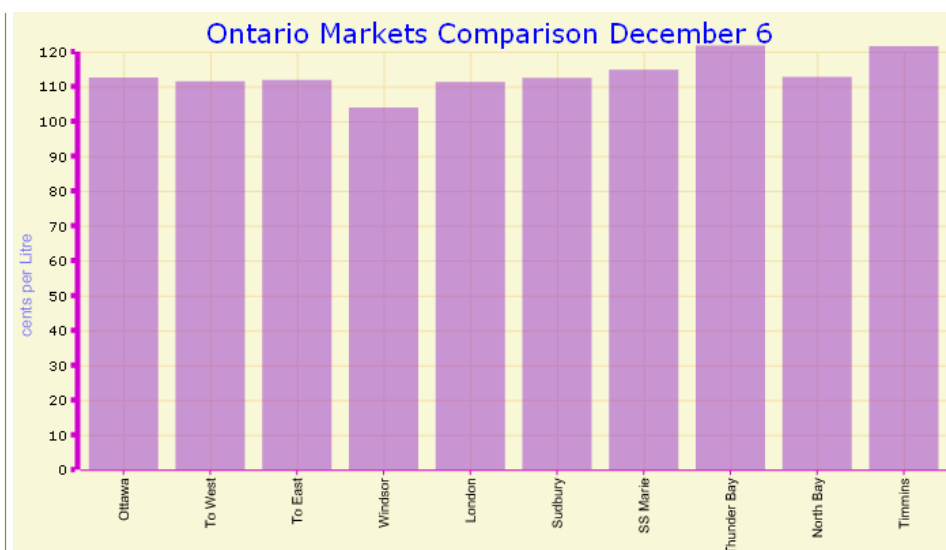
World crude oil prices above US\$89 a barrel and higher North American wholesale prices caused the Ontario average retail price of regular unleaded gasoline to increase by 4.0 cents to 112.0 cents a litre, its highest level since September 2008.

Prices rose by 10.1 cents in Thunder Bay, 5.6 cents in North Bay, 4.6 cents in Sudbury, 4.0 cents in Toronto, 3.7 cents in London, 3.5 cents in Ottawa, 3.0 cents in Timmins, and 2.8 cents in Sault Ste. Marie (all to a 26-month high). Prices in Windsor rose by 1.2 cents, but were still the lowest in our survey for the 22nd straight week. The average price gap between northern and southern Ontario widened from 2.8 cents to 5.1 cents, a three-month high. The Ontario average retail diesel price declined for the second straight week, by 0.3 cents to 107.4 cents.

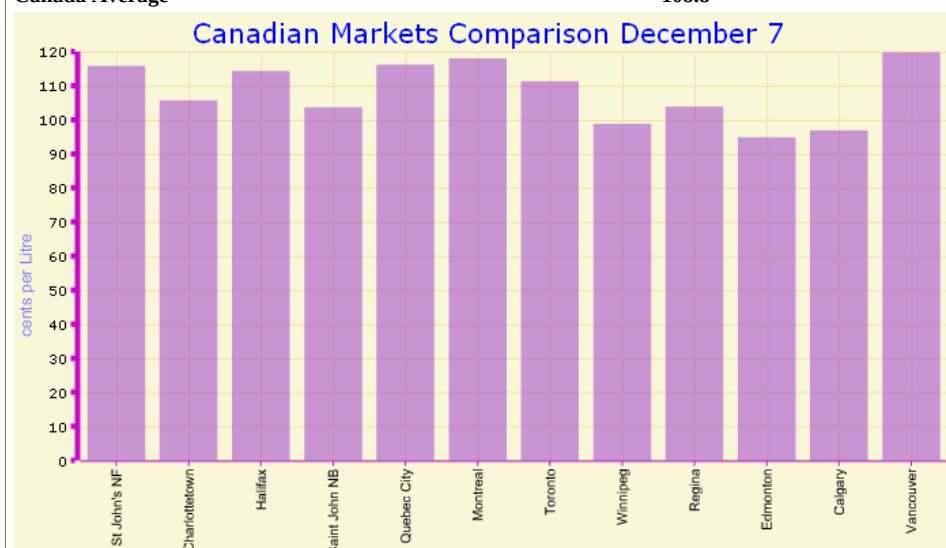
The Canadian average retail gasoline price increased for the second straight week, by 1.9 cents to 110.7 cents, its highest level since October 2008. Prices rose by 6.0 cents in Edmonton (to a seven-month high), 4.2 cents in Calgary (to a seven-month high), 3.8 cents in Quebec City (to a 26-month high), 3.0 cents in Winnipeg (to a three-month high), 2.7 cents in Vancouver (to a 26-month high), 2.1 cents in Charlottetown and Halifax (both to a 26-month high), 2.0 cents in Toronto, and 0.7 cents in Montreal. Prices fell by less than a cent in St. John's (from a 25-month high) and Saint John (from a seven-month high). The Canadian average retail diesel price increased by 0.9 cents to 110.5 cents, its highest level since November 2008.

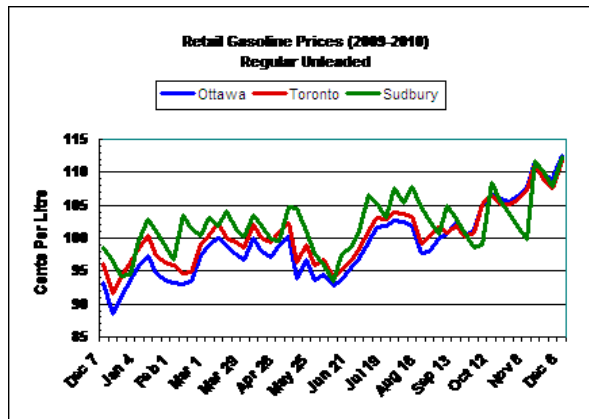
